The Feasts of Ascension and Pentecost mean somewhat the same. By Ascension Jesus ends His earthly mission and goes back to God the Father. Pentecost is the feast of the Holy Spirit coming down upon the Church as the gift of God -the Dad -- so the whole family could get everything it needs. This past Thursday was the Feast of Ascension, the 40th day of Jesus' Resurrection. The coming Sunday is the 50th day (the Greek word 'Pentecost' means 50) of Christ's resurrection. 

JUSTICE & PEACE

Continuing from last week on finding hope in a world of darkness. If we continue to look at evil in terms of punishment rather than mercy, forgiveness and healing, we will cease to be creative. The source of what we often

say, a metanoia, a fundamental change in attitude, will elude us. We live in a world where we see rules consistently being broken, but before we take that route, we have to know the rules. Saint Francis of Assisi did this when he gave up all possessions and wealth and took on the way of the poor. He had to live their life in order to understand it. This led him to be creative and to holiness. Are we are saying that we should do the same? No, we are not. We are saying that unless we see the world from the eyes of the poor and vulnerable, we cannot affect a change. We have to move from an individual believer, to a group believer, to a world believer. We need to find a sense of shared confidence with others in order to achieve that world movement, that word metanoia, that world change of attitudes. Wow that sounds like a lot but it starts with us. Do we know who we are? It started with Francis and moved out from there. This is the Christian hope for change. What does all this mean in terms of justice and peace? May we suggest a reading of Luke 15 where the parables of the lost sheep, the lost coin and the lost son are written. There is a reason for joy and celebration in each of these stories. So it is for any progress we make, no matter how small towards justice and peace.
