

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends.

The Solemn Feast of Pentecost: The Greek Word 'Pentecost' means 'Fifty'. We take this word Pentecost to mean 'Holy Spirit', the third Person of the Trinity. We attribute 'Pentecost' to the Holy Spirit who came upon the Apostles and others on the fiftieth day of the Resurrection of Jesus. The name of the day became the name of the Holy Spirit.

Birthday of the Church: This is the day the official preaching about Jesus Christ began by those who believed in Jesus. On this day 3,000 persons came forward to believe in Jesus and joined the group of believers. Thus began the Church of believers. Happy Birthday to the Church! Many happy returns of the day to our Community of Believers of which we too are a part. Happy Birthday to us!

We are the Temple of the Holy Spirit: In one of the

descriptions of the Trinity, we call God the Father, Creator, God the Son Jesus Christ, our Redeemer and the Holy Spirit, the Sanctifier. God the Creator has created us, keeps us alive and calls every one of us to live God's purpose in this world. God the Son reveals God the Father's self-giving love and reconciles us with God whenever we fall short of living God's Purpose. God the Holy Spirit lives in our hearts to inspire and strengthen us to live God's purpose. Through all the sacraments we receive the Holy Spirit comes and dwells in us, thus making us God's Temple.

Continuing from last week on finding hope in a world of darkness. In our last column we talked about knowing about ourselves. All of us have viewpoints but do we realize that it is a view from a point? This is something that we have to know and admit. Most of us live with a certain amount of blindness that is the cause of much suffering in the world. Many of us are caught up in our own self and do not or do not want to see the bigger picture. Unless we are aware of this, there is little chance of moving out past the self. We expect order in our lives and in the world but that is missing today in a lot of countries. We see destruction and disorder. A good example is 9-11. The rug was pulled out from under us. Another example is the recent bombing in Boston at the finish line of a marathon race. Dzhokhar Tsarnaev has been captured and is giving information. We will be hearing much more as time goes on. The cross is a good example of disorder, and Jesus was crucified because of opposites. He upset the common thought and teaching of the day. What does this all mean in terms of justice and peace? Jesus put us on a journey of discovery. It was a journey of change, a metanoia. The sad part of this freedom that Jesus offered us is that we prefer conformity and group loyalty over real change. This is what Francis wanted to change. He was happy when he broke away from the bounds of society. He was free from

the darkness and bathed in the light of Christ Jesus. Francis did not fight or flee his church and society. He came up with a third way of compassionate learning. These are the things we have to know and understand before change can occur for real progress in transforming the world. This is the Christian hope for change. It starts with ourselves and moves outward.
