FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Feast of our Patron, St. Thomas More.
Today is our Parish Feast! Happy Feast to all of us!
Let us celebrate with praying for each other at Mass;
Together as a Parish –Family enjoy the Pancake Breakfast;
Cheer our children in the Talent-Show, Enjoy the outdoor
Carnival; Paint faces, and have fun with the Dollar Menu lunch

That's the Spirit: A little boy appeared at the door, selling postcards for a dime. Someone asked what he was going to do with the money. He said, "I'm raising \$ 100,000 for our new church building." The startled customer replied, "Do you expect to raise it all by yourself?" He answered, "Oh, no sir; there are two of us!"

The ambitious goal did not in any way diminish the spirit of the boy even though he made a very low profit and did not have many hands to help him. His confidence in himself and his spirit was really strong that nothing could stop him from reaching his huge goal.

Today's Gospel describes what others think about Jesus. Knowing oneself through others is just like knowing your face through the mirror. But Jesus knows himself directly and what are His profundity and authenticity. Jesus is aware of His tough goal of dying on the cross and rising from death. It would have been easy for Jesus to go along with the popular opinion of Him. But Jesus preferred to obey His inner conviction of who He is. He did not let himself be directed by the opinion of others. To put it in today's terms, He was not depending upon poll numbers. He adhered to the Divine call -- God's plan for Him.

The Spirit of our Patron St. Thomas More was just like that

of Jesus. When he was condemned to death, his friends advised him on how he could bend the law and thus not only get out of his death sentence but also get his status back. St. Thomas More stood for his inner conviction of truth. He did not slip from his call of executing the law in the right manner. He faced death rather than negotiate with a lie. He lived his inner truth rather than live a falsehood for the rest of his life.

Today is our Parish Feast, Feast of our Patron, St. Thomas More. Happy Feast to all of us!: Let us celebrate our inner conviction of who we are just as our patron did. Let us stand up for our inner worth. As St. Paul says, let us not be "tossed by waves and swept along by every wind of teaching arising from human trickery, from their cunning in the interests of deceitful scheming. Rather, living the truth in love, we should grow in every way into him who is the head, Christ." (Letter to Ephesians 4:14-15).

Our Parish Motto is "Sharing the Spirit of Love." Today let us celebrate our Patron to revive our inner spiritual force to stand for truth as our Patron did. We gather every Sunday to discover our truth in Jesus by celebrating the Word of God and the presence of God in the mass. This Sunday we will do it in sharing the spirit of Love.
