Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

July 14, 2013 Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Deuteronomy 30: 10-14 Psalm 69: 14, 17, 30-31, 33-34, 36, 37 Colossians 1: 15-20 Luke: 10: 25-37

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

There was a scholar of the law who stood up to test him and said, Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus said to him, "What is written in the law? How do you read it?" He said in reply, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself." He replied to him, "You have answered correctly; do this and you will live." But because he wished to justify himself, he said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus replied, "A man fell victim to robbers as he went down from Jerusalem to Jericho. They stripped and beat him and went off leaving him half-dead. A priest happened to be going down that road, but when he saw him, he passed by on the opposite side. Likewise a Levite came to the place, and when he saw him, he passed by on the opposite side. But a Samaritan traveler who came upon him was moved with compassion at the sight. He approached the victim, poured oil and wine over his wounds and bandaged them. Then he lifted him up on his own animal, took him to an inn, and cared for him. The next day he took out two silver coins and gave them to the innkeeper with the instruction, 'Take care of him. If you spend more than what I have given you, I shall repay you on my way back.' Which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to the robbers' victim?" He answered, "The one who treated him with mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."

2. Describe a time when a stranger on the street asked for help. How did you respond?

3. Describe a time when you witnessed a Good Samaritan coming to the aid of a stranger.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

There is a story of two women who stood before the Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris. One asked, "Why can't we build structures like this anymore?" Her friend answered, "The people who built this had faith. Today we have only opinions. And you can't build a cathedral with opinions."

In Today's Gospel we read about Jesus sending his disciples with the power of faith in Him to do the big task of reaping the harvest of the Kingdom of God. Jesus advised them to carry neither money bag, nor sack, nor even sandals. But He empowered them with the message of peace and the power of healing. They should not be distracted by so-called material necessities to carry out their task (like money, personal needs, human support). Their mission would be successful when they totally depend on God's power and focus wholly on the Divine message.

Today's Gospel ends with the disciples' report about their mission. They witnessed the power of God in their mission; they could heal the sick and drive out demons by allowing in God's power in their mission to His people.

When we take up God's mission in today's world, we imitate the disciples of today's Gospel. We go with the message of God's peace to proclaim God's Kingdom. We are sent not with weapons to fight the enemies but with the power of God to influence even evil, to convert the power of sin to the possibility of life. We are missionaries of Jesus in today's world. Jesus asks to have faith in the truth of being His disciples filled with His divine power to do His mission of peace.

As missionaries of faith, on June 29th Catholics from various parishes of our Diocese marched a Rally for Religious Freedom. It was a great success in voicing our freedom to exercise the faith in Christ as Catholics! We had a large turnout of participants firmly committed and motivated to protecting the principles of religious freedom. The Rally was inspiring in that it was clear evidence of the emergence of the laity in the fight for religious freedom in the Diocese.

Bishop Murphy gave a great speech on religious liberty. He said, "We will not compromise our faith. We will not accept rules and regulations that violate our consciences or impose actions and practices that go against the moral teachings of our faith and our Church. We will not bend our knees to the false gods of secularism. We will not allow Caesar to re-define our faith or banish us, our Church or other religious faiths, from the public square to the shadows of our cities or the walled gardens of our inner selves. AND WE WILL NOT GIVE UP OR GIVE IN!"


