## **FR. ANTONY'S LETTER**

Dear Friends,

**Today's Gospel is the story of the Good Samaritan-** Jesus used this story as an answer to the question asked by the lawyer. The lawyer's main question is what he should do in order to inherit eternal life. Jesus answers him that he should do what the law demands – Love God and Love neighbor. The lawyer has no problem of knowing and loving God. His main problem is with the neighbor - How to know who the neighbor is.

**Jesus does not reply to him like a lawyer** legally defining who the neighbor is. Jesus narrates a situation in which people react to the man who was robbed. At the end Jesus asks the lawyer to identify the one who acted as a real neighbor to the wounded man. The lawyer now goes beyond the legal definition of a neighbor and reaches the definition from his heart. He arrives at an understanding of who the neighbor is, not from the previously defined categories of law, but from his new awareness of how one reacts to a given situation.

**Jesus invites us to respond to human situations,** human miseries, sufferings, and needs from our heart which can sometimes be easily hardened by our own biases, preconceptions, and convenient ideologies. Loving God is easy but to react to any human problem with a heart of God needs an attitude of a Good Samaritan.

**But what shall we do when we are threatened** in our freedom to express our faith as Good Samaritans? Or what should we do

when we are forced by laws and authorities to react to human needs only in the way they dictate to us and not in the way our faith informs us? Slowly we Catholics and our institutions are being pushed to do what the secular government forces us to do. In the land of the free we need to raise our voices of freedom to exercise our faith in reacting to human needs of preserving human life from conception to natural death.

**We need religious freedom to be Good Samaritans** to promote and preserve life which is beaten everyday though various laws and practices based on convenient ideologies purely for the sake of political expediencies. Our parish patron St. Thomas More stood for the freedom of expressing his religious faith. He did not compromise his freedom for any political advantage.

**To continue in the spirit of our Patron,** our bulletin will carry news and quotes about what our catholic laity and leaders actively say and do for our religious freedom around the parish and the diocese. In our parish a group of people meet periodically to get into catholic action for religious freedom. The Bulletin will announce the time and the place of these gatherings. Please join them and become a voice of Good Samaritans to promote and preserve life in a Catholic way. As Fr. Terence Henry, President of Franciscan University says, "My dear friends, the age of casual Catholicism is over. The age of heroic Catholicism has begun."
