

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray just as John taught his disciples." He said to them, "When you pray, say: Father, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come. FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A great religious persecution broke out in the land and the three Pillars of religion – Scripture, Worship and Charity – appeared before God to express their fear that if religion were to be stamped out they would cease to exist. "Not to worry," said the Lord. "I plan to send One to earth who is greater than all of you."

"What is the name of this Great One?" asked the three pillars of Religion.

"Self-Knowledge" said God. "Self-Knowledge will do greater things than any of you have done."

This week's Gospel is the story of Martha and Mary. Here Jesus explains about the two pillars of religion, "Scripture and Worship" in the person of Mary listening to Jesus. Last week, Jesus spoke about Charity, through the story of the Good Samaritan. In the story of Martha and Mary, the serving lady Martha is downplayed while Mary, who is listening to Jesus, is chosen by Jesus as model to be imitated. In the story of the Good Samaritan, the priest and the Levite who did not care for the man who fell victim to the robbers are downplayed by Jesus. The Samaritan who charitably served the man was set as a model to be followed.

When we put both the stories together we get the deeper message that as disciples of Jesus we have to be active like the Good Samaritan in doing charity, and at

the same time we have to listen to Jesus like Mary, reading Scriptures and worshiping.

In both stories the main thrust of Jesus is not simply to do for the sake of doing, but to do everything from the inner self that listens to Jesus. Jesus teaches us to act from our inner self - knowledge that get from Scripture and Worship, from our sitting at the feet of Jesus like Mary of today's Gospel. Jesus supports Mary because she is doing what her heart tells her, that is to listen to Jesus. Whereas Martha's part is downplayed because her complaint came from her comparison with Mary's sitting comfortably at the feet of Jesus and leaving Martha alone to work. In the Good Samaritan story Jesus teaches the lawyer the same thing - to do what he clearly understood in his heart who is his the neighbor.

Both stories invite us to look at the motivation of why we do what we do. They call us to self-knowledge as to the source of our Charity, Scripture reading or Worship. Or to put the same truth in other words, all our charities, Scripture readings, praying and worship must grow in us a self-knowledge that what we do is not for the sake of doing but from a self-knowledge of what God wants us to do.

Our mission: to help people incorporate St. Thomas More Parish Outreach and the St. Thomas St. Vincent de Paul Conference.

We always need personal care items like deodorants and toothpaste and shampoos (and conditioner, if you can), but we also need staples such as coffee, ketchup, mustard, mayonnaise, rice, pasta, soup, flour, sugar, canned goods (soup or vegetables), cereal, crackers, tuna, mac and cheese, etc. Anything would be greatly appreciated at Outreach, from 10 – 2 Monday through Thursday, or dropped off in the bin in the lobby of St. Thomas More. Again, any fresh produce would be especially gratifying !!!!

<u>SMITHTOWN SENIOR CITIZENS' DEPARTMENT</u> REPAIR SERVICES

The Smithtown Senior Citizens Department provides 2 minor home repair services that do not require the skills of a licensed craftsman, for senior citizens. There are NO emergency services provided, and are available to Smithtown town residents ONLY.

The Senior Citizens Home Maintenance Program is for homeowners 62 years of age or older with an annual income of \$59,400 or below for a single resident, or \$67,900 or below for a couple. A brief in-home assessment is required for

eligibility. Materials and repairs will be provided at no cost for qualified Seniors from our Community Development Department funded by a federal grant through HUD. The Residential Repair Program is for Seniors 60 years and older. This service is provided by the Suffolk County Office for the Aging, the New York State Office for the Aging, and the Town of Smithtown. There are no income limitations. Eligible clients must provide or pay for materials for the job, but there are no charges for repairs.




