FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

An old pilgrim was making his way to the Himalayan Mountains in the bitter cold of winter when it began to rain. An innkeeper said to him, "How will you ever get there in this kind of weather, my good man?"

The old man answered cheerfully, "My heart got there first, so it's easy for the rest of me to follow."

In today's Gospel Jesus speaks about 'PRAYER' which is a conversation of the heart. Prayer is manifold in expression but it all starts from one source, the human heart. Prayer is said in words, sung in melodies, takes the form of gestures like sitting, standing, and dancing. Sometime prayer is a still silence. As Prayer is the expression of the heart, it is not important in what form the prayer is said but where it comes from and what makes you pray.

When the disciples asked Jesus to teach them to pray, Jesus teaches them the 'Our Father', a formal prayer which we use even today in our personal and public prayers. Then Jesus moves on to explain the disposition of the heart that prays. It is

the external form that constitutes the prayer to be a prayer. It is ultimately the heart the makes any external expression into a valuable prayer.

Prayer is a persistent plea to God when the heart depends only and totally on God. Jesus explains this with the story of a person persistently knocking at the door of his friend with the hope that he will ultimately get what he is looking for.

Prayer is a petition with an unshakable and unalterable hope in God. Jesus explains with a figure of speech. Will the parents give their child a stone when asked for bread or will they give a snake for fish, or a scorpion for an egg? Pray with sure hope. When our prayers become 'an asking with hope we will get' 'a seeking with unshakable trust we will find' 'a knocking with child-like belief in God we will find the door open.'

On July 27 Saturday at the 5:00pm mass we will celebrate the first death anniversary of our former beloved Pastor Msgr. Francis Midura. The memorial mass will be followed by the grand opening and dedication of the New Kitchen in his name, and wine tasting.

I wholeheartedly thank Michelle Strollo, Msgr. Midura's niece who is gracious and generous to host this event in memory of her uncle. She helped to waive the cost of the Wine Tasting. Even though admission is free, since we have only limited seats in the celebration halls you need the free ticket issued at the Rectory to be part of the wine tasting.

Consequently, the needs of others tend to be forgotten. Specifically, our supplies are dangerously low. We need everything! If you can spare anything from your pantry at home, or even add a couple of items to your food cart this week to drop off at Outreach, it would be so greatly appreciated!!!! We always need personal care items like deodorants and toothpaste and shampoos (and conditioner, if you can), but we also need staples such as coffee, ketchup, mustard, mayonnaise, rice, pasta, soup, flour, sugar, canned goods (soup or vegetables), cereal, crackers, tuna, mac and cheese, etc. Anything would be greatly appreciated at Outreach, from 10 – 2 Monday through Thursday, or dropped off in the bin in the lobby of St.

Thomas More. Again, any fresh produce would be especially gratifying!!!!

<u>SMITHTOWN SENIOR CITIZENS' DEPARTMENT</u> <u>REPAIR SERVICES</u>

The Smithtown Senior Citizens Department provides 2 minor home repair services that do not require the skills of a licensed craftsman, for senior citizens. There are NO emergency services provided, and are available to Smithtown town residents ONLY.

<u>The Senior Citizens Home Maintenance Program</u> is for homeowners 62 years of age or older with an annual income of \$59,400 or below for a single resident, or \$67,900 or below for a couple. A brief in-home assessment is required for eligibility. Materials and repairs will be provided at no cost

for qualified Seniors from our Community Development Department funded by a federal grant through HUD.

The Residential Repair Program is for Seniors 60 years and older. This service is provided by the Suffolk County Office for the Aging, the New York State Office for the Aging, and the Town of Smithtown. There are no income limitations. Eligible clients must provide or pay for materials for the job, but there are no charges for repairs.
