A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus said to his disciples: “Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom. Sell your belongings and give alms. Provide money bags for yourselves that do not wear out, an inexhaustible treasure in heaven that no thief can reach nor moth destroy. For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be.

“Gird your loins and light your lamps and be like servants who await their master’s return from a wedding, ready to open immediately when he comes and knocks. Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival. Amen, I say to you, he will gird himself, have them recline at table, and proceed to wait on them. And should he come in the second or third watch and find them prepared in this way, blessed are those servants. Be sure of this: if the master of the house had known the hour when the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into. You also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come.”

Then Peter said, “Lord, is this parable meant for us or for everyone?” And the Lord replied, “Who, then, is the faithful and prudent steward whom the master will put in charge of his servants to distribute the food allowance at the proper time? Blessed is that servant whom his master on arrival finds doing so. Truly, I say to you, the master will put the servant in charge of all his property. But if that servant says to himself, ‘My master is delayed in coming,’ and begins to beat the menservants and the maidservants, to eat and drink and get drunk, then that servant’s master will come on an unexpected day and at an unknown hour and will punish the servant severely and assign him a place with the unfaithful. That servant who knew his master’s will but did not make preparations nor act in accord with his will shall be beaten severely; and the servant who was ignorant of his master’s will but acted in a way deserving of a severe beating shall be beaten only lightly. Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more.”

Focus Questions:

1. Relate an experience when you tried to do the right thing and you encountered resistance or conflict.
2. What do you find difficult about following Jesus?
3. Relate a time when there was division in your family. What helped heal the division?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Garry met his friend Jim walking down the street with blisters on both his ears. Garry asked him what happened to cause the blisters. Jim replied, "My wife left her iron on, and when the phone rang I picked up the iron by mistake."
"Yes, but what about the other ear?" asked Garry.
"The stupid friend called back" Jim replied angrily.
When we are not aware of what is going on around us, we can easily fall prey to our circumstances. If we are not conscious of our own inner identity of who we are, we will be freely defined by our possessions or people around us.
In today's Gospel Jesus speaks about awareness of life in the image of a servant waiting for the master's arrival. If the servant forgets his identity of being a servant and begins to misuse the luxury of the master's home, he will be in great trouble when the master arrives at an unexpected hour.
Jesus instructs us that life is primarily an awareness of who we are. We can easily be carried away by what is around us. We can easily fall prey to anything that is less than who we are if we forget our identity. If we don't approach life with an attitude of the servant of today's Gospel, we will miss life. If we handle life with an attitude of a servant, life will wait on us like the master of today's Gospel. Life is served to us. The more we serve it the more we will receive it.

Today's Gospel ends with the other image of making us as the master of our life. If the master of the house had known the hour when the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into. There is a danger of our life being stolen away from us, if we are not vigilant to safeguard our inner worth. If we allow ourselves to be stolen or carried away by forces outside of us we will not be masters of ourselves any more

Our prayers and worship of God, our scripture readings and service to others are the spiritual attempts to remind ourselves of our identity. Let us be aware of our identity and serve it to others. Let us be consciously vigilant to safeguard it, or else it will be stolen by forces outside of us.

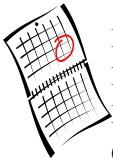
