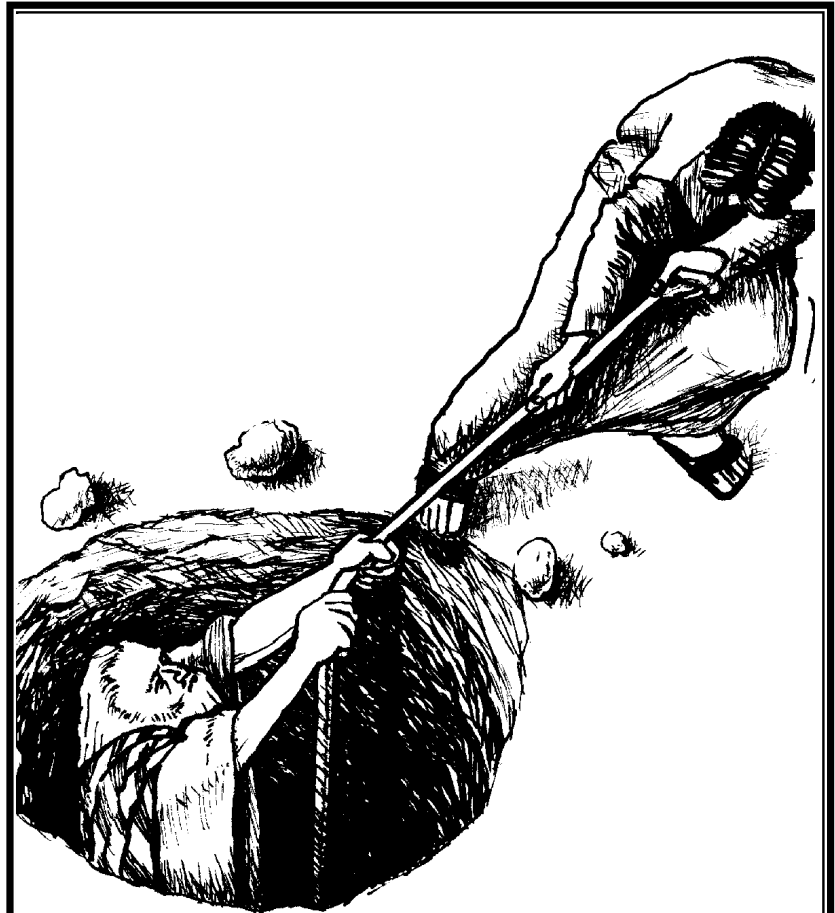

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Today's Gospel is one of the hardest sayings of Jesus. "Do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division." Then He explains how His presence will cause division in the family where we have a more secured relationship than anywhere else.

We know "blood is thicker than water." Our family has a stronger influence on us than any other type of relationship. Our family has formed our personality more than any other power outside of the family. Before we learn anything from others, we begin to learn from our family by imitating what we see in them.

But there comes a time in our life when we have to cut the umbilical cord and stand as individuals. In our American legal system at the age of 18 or 21 (depending on the issue of life) a person is independent to decide and choose the way of life he/she wants. That is when the family relationship comes to be at stake with a person's personal decision. How much should a family influence a person's decision? Or how much is a person free to go against the family to stand for the choice he/she has made?

The message of today's Gospel is not about how much the individual goes with or against the family. It is rather about what influences the decision-making process of an individual. Is life one's own choice to decide what she/he wants to be? Or is it the choice of the family (parents, siblings and other relatives) to form and mold the member of the family?

When Jesus says in today's Gospel, "I have come to set the earth on fire and how I wish it were already blazing" Jesus wants Himself to be the influencing force in the decision-making process of His believers. It is neither the individual self nor the family relationship that will play an important role.

Jesus wants to be the influencing force in our decision-making process. He wants to be accomplished in our life, even if it were to go against our own family's traditional influences or relationships.

Jesus' aim is not to cause any division in the family but to call us to be totally and radically influenced by Him even to the extent of renouncing one's own umbilical relationship of family. In another saying Jesus call us to renounce one's own self in order to be influenced by Him, "if anyone comes to me without hating.....even his own life, he cannot be my disciple." (Luke 14:26)

Thus today's Gospel asks us, "Who influences us in our decision making process? Our family? Friends? Our own convenient self? Or God's call revealed to us in Jesus? How far are we to go with Jesus' influence, to the level of denying ourselves, even our closest relationship? When we begin to answer these questions we will understand the hardest saying of Jesus, "Do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division."

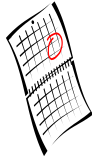
