
MARRIAGE—As soon as a couple decides to marry, and BEFORE making any other arrangements, call the Church Office to schedule an appointment with one of the deacons.

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

On a sabbath Jesus went to dine at the home of one of the leading Pharisees, and the people there were observing him carefully. He told a parable to those who had been invited, noticing how they were choosing the places of honor at the table.

"When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not recline at table in the place of honor. A more distinguished guest than you may have been invited by him, and the host who invited both of you may approach you and say, 'Give your place to this man,' and then you would proceed with embarrassment to take the lowest place. Rather, when you are invited, go and take the lowest place so that when the host comes to you he may say, 'My friend, move up to a higher position.' Then you will enjoy the esteem of your companions at the table. For every one who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

Then he said to the host who invited him,

"When you hold a lunch or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or your wealthy neighbors, in case they may invite you back and you have repayment. Rather, when you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you. For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Bill Keane, the creator of the popular "Family Circus" **comic strip** was penciling in one of his cartoons. His son Jeffy asked, "Daddy, how do you know what to draw?" Keane answered, "God tells me." Then Jeffy innocently responded, "Then why do you keep erasing parts of it?" Working with God means a willingness to give up our own selfish goals. God inspires us to do noble work and expects our cooperation to accomplish it. Our cooperation with God demands that both God and we walk the same path and do the same thing in order to arrive at the Goal. Due to our weakness or convenient selfishness we may like to go our own way or expect God to oblige our way. On such occasions our cooperating with God will seem like we are walking through a narrow door as the Gospel portrays today. It is something like not being able to draw a picture as we would like, but erasing our own drawings multiple times so as to get the perfect picture that God and we can draw together with God's inspiration and through our expression.

It does not matter how many pictures we draw or what profit we make out of them, or how popular we become. What really matters is how well we shine as the light and glory of God in our work of drawing. In the Gospel today Jesus answers the question, "Lord, will only few people be

saved?" The question portrays the worry that only a few and not many will be saved.

Jesus, the Son of God should have saved more number of people for all that He has done for them. Jesus focuses not on quantity but quality. The Kingdom of God preached by Jesus, is not what we do mechanically or merely physically. It is "not a matter of food and drink, but of righteousness, peace, and joy in the Holy Spirit; whoever serves Christ in this way is pleasing to God..." (Romans 14:17-18). The Kingdom of God is what we do consciously from the heart – a life of willingly cooperating with God, a ready mind set to erase all our selfishness as many times as needed, in order to depict the inspiration of God in as perfect a picture as possible through our personal expression.
