

Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

September 8, 2013 Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time Wisdom 9:13-18b Psalm 90: 3-4, 5-6, 12-13, 14-17 Philemon 9-10, 12-17 Luke: 14: 25-33

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

Great crowds were traveling with Jesus, and he turned and addressed them,

"If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple. Which of you wishing to construct a tower does not first sit down and calculate the cost to see if there is enough for its completion? Otherwise, after laying the foundation and finding himself unable to finish the work the onlookers should laugh at him and say, 'This one began to build but did not have the resources to finish.' Or what king marching into battle would not first sit down and decide whether with ten thousand troops he can successfully oppose another king advancing upon him with twenty thousand troops? But if not, while he is still far away, he will send a delegation to ask for peace terms. In the same way, anyone of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple."

Focus Questions:

1. Describe a time when you felt like too much was being asked of you. How did you react?

2. What are you doing to be a faithful witness to Jesus in your life?

3. Relate a time when you did not plan ahead. What were the results? How does your experience relate to the Gospel?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

People don't care how much you know until they know how much you care. How much we care about others is the measure of how much we will be known by others. Our worth consists neither in how much we know (knowledge) nor in how much we possess (wealth). Our worth is expressed in how we relate to others. Our worth is lived out in the love we have for others.

In today's Gospel Jesus teaches about our claim of who we are through the images of the host and guests at a party. The way we value ourselves may not be the same as that of the host who invited us. In any human gathering holding the other to be higher in value than ourselves is the best way of relating with others. A person who wishes to respect and relate with others does not start with any personal claim but with an open heart accepting the other's worth.

Considering others to be higher than us does not mean that we have a poor self-image of ourselves. Rather it is our voluntariness not to see others as below us, and it reflects our generosity of treating others with respect. It also allows others to see our worth not from our claim of who we are. Rather it invites them to realize our worth from their acknowledgement of who we are.

Our personal claim of who we are might be proved wrong if the host acknowledges another invited guest to be higher than us. Jesus is not teaching false humility so that we can be exalted. Nor does Jesus say that humility is a guarantee for exaltation. The lesson of Jesus in today's Gospel is that our worth does not consist in our personal claim but in our magnanimity of acknowledging the worth of others. Our superiority blossoms in acknowledging that of others. We will live when we let others live. As the old saying goes, "Give respect and get respect."
