

September 29, 2013 Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time Amos: 6: 1a, 4-7 Psalm 146: 7, 8-9, 9-10 1 Timothy 6: 11-16

Luke: 16: 19-31

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus said to the Pharisees: "There was a rich man who dressed in purple garments and fine linen and dined sumptuously each day. And lying at his door was a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who would gladly have eaten his fill of the scraps that fell from the rich man's table. Dogs even used to come and lick his sores. When the poor man died, he was carried away by angels to the bosom of Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried, and from the netherworld, where he was in torment, he raised his eyes and saw Abraham far off and Lazarus at his side. And he cried out, 'Father Abraham, have pity on me. Send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am suffering torment in these flames.' Abraham replied, 'My child, remember that you received what was good during your lifetime while Lazarus likewise received what was bad; but now he is comforted here, whereas you are tormented. Moreover, between us and you a great chasm is established to prevent anyone from crossing who might wish to go from our side to yours or from your side to ours.' He said, 'Then I beg you, father, send him to my father's house, for I have five brothers, so that he may warn them, lest they too come to this place of torment.' But Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the prophets. Let them listen to them.' He said, 'Oh no, father Abraham, but if someone from the dead goes to them, they will repent.' Then Abraham said, 'If they will not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead."

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends.

Three men were discussing what is most essential in a car: "Dependability"; "Styling"; "Economy." Just then a fourth man, who had recently bought his family a new car, entered the room. They decided to pose the question to him. They asked, "Just what is the thing you would like most to get out of your new car?" He immediately responded, "My teenage son."

Life is just like the car. Its main purpose is to give us a safe travel. But at times we can lose sight of the essential and begin to value the superficial as essential. In the Gospel today, the servant considers wealth as the essential value of his life, and for which he is ready to do anything to justify the unjust. Jesus ironically commends his action. He asks His

disciples to imitate the servant in doing good; to employ the same interest and energy to do good.

What we consider as essential in life becomes the motivating energy in shaping our life. The servant in the Gospel considered wealth as the essential factor of his life. Thus that which he considered essential gave him all that was needed to justify even the unjustified. Jesus asks us to name what we consider as essential in life. We know that we believe in God and want to make all that is of God to be the essentials of our life. But if we are not daring to do everything possible to live those essentials, then we have not considered God as our essential. Let us put God as our first and we will soon find the right essentials of our life, which in turn will give us enough energy to live our life fully.

This week Marie and Ross Bracco have shared their story.....

Ministry Matters....FOCCUS - by Marie and Ross Bracco

FOCCUS is an acronym for Facilitating Open Couple Communication, Understanding and Study.

The FOCCUS program at St. Thomas More Parish is administered by five married couples who want to help prepare engaged couples for married life. We do this by inviting them into our homes and having them answer, by means of a pencil and paper survey, at least 156 questions. Answers are then recorded on a graph which can show the prospective bride and groom areas about which they may need to better communicate – prior to marriage.

Ross and I first heard about FOCCUS from Jim and Marie Marsala, former coordinators of the Pre-Cana Program. We joined it at the start, and after a while became program coordinators. FOCCUS is a supplement to Pre-Cana as it deals with young people's unique issues, helps them tell each other, in the presence of the sponsor couple, how they think/feel/react to important topics.

Since 1999 St. Thomas More has served several hundred young (and older!) couples coming to marry in our parish. We and other sponsor couples love meeting these folks, who are just beginning their lives together, with all their hopes and dreams. We enjoy sharing some of our own life experience as well.

We truly believe that the combination of FOCCUS and Pre-Cana are ideal for marriage preparation, since they complement each other so well on a parish level. We realize that weddings are important, but life together afterward is what we "focus" on.

At present our ministry includes four other sponsor couples. We are presently seeking two additional couples due to a recent influx of many engaged couples – and that's a good thing!!
