# Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

November 3, 2013 Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time Wisdom 11:22--12:2 Psalm 145:1-2, 8-9, 10-11, 13, 14 2 Thessalonians 1:11--2:2 Luke 19:1-10

### A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

At that time, Jesus came to Jericho and intended to pass through the town. Now a man there named Zacchaeus. who was a chief tax collector and also a wealthy man, was seeking to see who Jesus was; but he could not see him because of the crowd, for he was short in stature. So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree in order to see Jesus, who was about to pass that way. When he reached the place, Jesus looked up and said, "Zacchaeus, come down quickly, for today I must stay at your house." And he came down quickly and received him with joy. When they all saw this, they began to grumble, saying, "He has gone to stay at the house of a sinner." But Zacchaeus stood there and said to the Lord, "Behold, half of my possessions, Lord, I shall give to the poor, and if I have extorted anything from anyone I shall repay it four times over." And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house because this man too is a descendant of Abraham. For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost."

## FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Jim recently ran into Rosa who used to clean his house and was surprised to hear that she was still at it, despite her advanced age. "How do you manage it?" He asked. She explained her secret: "I just keep clients who can't see the dirt any better than I can." Rosa conveniently chose her clients to fit (justify) her poor eye sight. She defined her work in terms of what she could and could not do in terms of cleanliness of the houses of her clients.

In today's Gospel Jesus tells a story of two persons, a Pharisee and a tax collector. Both of them call upon

God with the same cry of 'O God', but there is a vast difference between their calls. The Pharisee thanks God for all that he does for God. He feels that God and he have a special relationship with each other because of what he does for God. On the other hand, the tax collector expresses his relationship with God in terms of what God does for him. The Pharisee demands a special relationship with God and enumerates all what he does for God. Whereas the tax collector craves and begs for God's relationship by crying, "be merciful to me a sinner." The Pharisee wants God to relate with him for what he is. The tax collector wants God to relate with him for who God is.

What is religion? Or what are religious activities like prayer, fasting, sacraments or worship? They are but channels to reveal to us who we are and who God is for us. They make us realize the truth that we are not the standard of our life. We are not the center, and everything does not revolve around us. We have our own limitations. Thus we need others around us to create life possible for us. In this living together with others we are called to see a bigger truth of God being merciful to us to keep us and the universe alive. Our call to live here is not to get reduced in our own world like the Pharisee, but to enlarge in to God's family of all of us in the universe and to live in God's mercy.

This Sunday October 27<sup>th</sup> at the 10:45 mass there will be a rite of welcome for Edward Savarese and Andrea Barth who begin RCIA to explore, learn and live the Catholic way of faith in Jesus Christ. They will be in the program for the next five months and will receive the sacraments of Baptism, First Communion and Confirmation at the Easter Vigil service . Please encourage them and pray for them.

October 31st Halloween - November 1st All **Saints.** The origin of the word *Halloween* is Christian. Halloween falls on the evening before the Christian holy days of All Hallows' Day (also known as All Saints', Hallowmas or Hallow tide) on November 1 and All Souls' Day on November 2, thus giving the holiday on October 31st the full name of All Hallows' Eve which in popular use became *Halloween* Our belief is that God calls us to be saints and has given us the power to become saints. Thus when we celebrate our inner power identity of being saints on November 1st, we rightfully ridicule and make fun of evil on the eve of 'All Saints' feast. The Halloween costumes are geared towards making fun of the evil only to highlight the goodness and the saintliness with which we are created. How about All Saint and Costume Mass on November

1<sup>st</sup>: In the background of what I explained above I invite all children, teens and adults with your Halloween costumes to attend the All Saints mass on Friday, November 1<sup>st</sup> at 7:00pm which will be followed by refreshments Also some of us can come in any garment of a Saint (like St. Francis of Assisi, St. Elizabeth Ann Seaton, St. Kateri Tekakwitha, the first Native American Saint etc.). Thus we can celebrate our potential to be saints by ridiculing all that is non-saintly and evil.




