A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

Some Sadducees, those who deny that there is a resurrection, came forward and put this question to Jesus, saying, "Teacher, Moses wrote for us, *If someone's brother dies leaving a wife but no child, his brother must take the wife and raise up descendants for his brother.* Now there were seven brothers; the first married a woman but died childless. Then the second and the third married her, and likewise all the seven died childless. Finally the woman also died. Now at the resurrection whose wife will that woman be? For all seven had been married to her." Jesus said to them, "The children of this age marry and remarry; but those who are deemed worthy to attain to the coming age and to the resurrection of the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. They can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise. That the dead will rise even Moses made known in the passage about the bush, when he called out 'Lord, ' the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob; and he is not God of the dead, but of the living, for to him all are alive."

Focus Questions:

1. Relate a time when someone questioned you about your faith. How did you respond?
2. How does your belief in the resurrection affect how you live your life?
3. Recall your experience of losing someone you loved to death.

Family and children's question:

Luke reminds us that God is a God of the living. How do you celebrate life and being alive?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

It is said of St. Stanislaus that while he was playing soccer his superior asked him, "what would you do if God comes to visit you right now?". He replied, "I would continue to play soccer." His answer only shows that St. Stanislaus was ready to meet God at any time and in any event of his life.

In the Gospel story Jesus invited himself to the home of Zacchaeus. Zacchaeus who went up on a tree out of curiosity just to see what Jesus looks like, was joyful to welcome him to his house.

Others criticized Jesus for going to Zacchaeus; but that neither stopped Jesus dining with him, nor discouraged Zacchaeus converting from his former way of life.

Jesus is ready to come to us as he went to Zacchaeus, but only those who are ready to welcome him like Zacchaeus will hear the call of Jesus' willingness to come to their house.

In the first reading, the Book of Wisdom puts forth this truth in fine words. "For you love all things that are and loathe nothing that you have made for what you hated you would not have fashioned. ... But you spare all things because they are yours, O Lord and lover of Souls.... You rebuke offenders little by little, warn them, and remind them of their sins they are committing, that they may abandon their wickedness and believe in you, O Lord!"

God in Jesus is always ready to come to us. How ready are we to recognize God knocking at our door? Are we ready to let God in at any time and into all situations of our life?

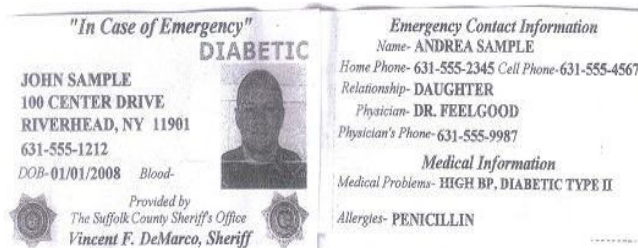
