A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

While some people were speaking about how the temple was adorned with costly stones and votive offerings, Jesus said, "All that you see here--the days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down." Then they asked him, "Teacher, when will this happen? And what sign will there be when all these things are about to happen?" He answered, "See that you not be deceived, for many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he,' and 'The time has come.' Do not follow them! When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for such things must happen first, but it will not immediately be the end." Then he said to them, "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be powerful earthquakes, famines, and plagues from place to place; and awesome sights and mighty signs will come from the sky. "Before all this happens, however, they will seize and persecute you, they will hand you over to the synagogues and to prisons, and they will have you led before kings and governors because of my name. It will lead to your giving testimony. Remember, you are not to prepare your defense beforehand, for I myself shall give you a wisdom in speaking that all your adversaries will be powerless to resist or refute. You will even be handed over by parents, brothers, relatives, and friends, and they will put some of you to death. You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives."

2. If you were on trial for being a follower of Jesus, what would the evidence be?
3. What would you do differently if you knew the world was coming to an end?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A five year old girl, returning home from the funeral of her grandmother, rode in a car with her other grandmother. "Where did Grandma go?" she asked. "We believe she went to be with God," the other Grandmother replied. "How old was she?" "She was eighty years old." "How old are you?" "I am eighty three." The little girl thought a bit, then said, "I hope God hasn't forgotten you!" **During the month of November we pray for the dead.** Nature sets the mood for it. The trees change color, shed leaves and soon will stand bare just with their trunks and branches. They go to sleep in winter only to spring again in Spring.

The liturgy of November invites us to reflect on our death and Resurrection in Christ. November 1st is 'All Saints Day'. On this feast we celebrate that God calls us all to be saints and will gather us as God's family in heaven. On November 2nd we celebrate 'All Souls Day' to remind ourselves that our human destiny of dying is actually changed by Christ to rise again with Christ for those who believe in Him.

The Sunday readings of November like this Sunday describe our death and resurrection in Christ and the end of the world. The final week of November is the feast of Christ the King, in which we will express our faith that our human history will reach its fullness in Christ. Thus the month of November invites us to see our end in God. As nature is dying only to renew in Spring so we all will die one day only to rise again in Jesus for eternity.

On November 1st we celebrated 'All Saints Costume Mass'. Some 15 of us came dressed as different saints like St. Theresa of Lisieux, St. Francis of Assisi, St. Joan of Arc, St. Veronica etc. Over 50 children came in different attractive Halloween Costumes. The children and the saints spread the message powerfully through their costumes that we are all called to believe and live the saintly power God has invested in us so that we can turn evil and horror into the goodness and beauty of God. I thank all those who appeared in costumes as Saints. I greatly appreciate all the parents and the children who attended the mass with their beautiful costumes.

Close of the year of Faith: In order that we may close this Year of Faith in a very spiritual way, parishes of our Deanery are scheduled to have Eucharistic Adoration from November 24 to 26..

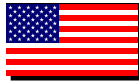

Ministry Matters at St Thomas More

We are so fortunate to have people sharing their gifts with our parish in so many wonderful ways...Here is a reflection on a very necessary ministry:

**Altar Linen Ministry

I started doing altar linens in 1969 at St Thomas More when it was still located in the "Factory of Love." Actually, I switched from the cleaning ministry because doing linens allowed me to help our church and still be at home with my three daughters, who at the time were all under the age of four.

I remember as a young girl, washing my dolls' clothes and ironing them. I recall a sense of accomplishment at doing that. Washing and ironing the altar purificators and fingertip towels (no larger than a man's handkerchief) – gives me that same feeling of satisfaction and pride.

Why do we as a small committee do this? Individually and as a team, there is a sense of accomplishment when preparing the altar linens used at Mass and for other religious occasions. Beyond that, **we are using our God-given talents for the glory of God.** I believe it is an honor to provide this small service to the Church. We are giving back to God a small gift for all He has given us. **I say a short prayer with each piece of linen** that is ironed. Somehow it makes the time pass quickly as **I build my relationship with Jesus.**

Currently there are five women in this ministry – and we could certainly use more – even men – (yes, there have been some men over the years!) – so, if this service to God interests you, we would welcome you to this satisfying ministry. It's something you can do at home, and at the same time increase your personal prayer time.
