A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:
 When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, “Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage.” When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, “In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet:

*And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah,
 are by no means least among the rulers of Judah;
 since from you shall come a ruler,
 who is to shepherd my people Israel.”*

Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star’s appearance. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, “Go and search diligently for the child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage.” After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way.

2. The light of the star guided the wise men. How open are you to being guided by God’s light?
3. How do you deal with the Herods of this world who try to stop people from encountering Jesus?

FR. ANTONY’S LETTER

Dear Friends,

When the three-year-old son was shown a portrait of his five older brothers taken when they were much younger, he pointed and said, “Those guys are wearing my clothes!” The basic trait of the family is passing the gift of life from one generation to the other, from grandparents to parents,

from parents to children and grandchildren, from older generation of siblings to the younger ones.

This Sunday is the Feast of Holy Family. When God became human he did not jump out of heaven as a human being, but was born as a child of a family. A family of a mother and a father with their children is the God given way for us to grow as humans. The Holy Family reminds us the real spiritual power of every human family in two ways; 1) that even God can be born as a human child of a father and mother; 2) that a father or mother can experience God’s presence in their child.

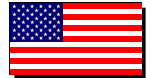


PARISH OUTREACH & ST. VINCENT de PAUL NEWS

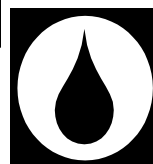

My name is Gabrielle Petagna. I have been a lector for seven years. I began in this ministry when I was in the 5th grade. I knew I wanted to be involved in the church in some way, and my parents encouraged me to try. If I am to be totally honest, there was a bit of a selfish reason for my joining also – I was rather shy at the time, and struggled with public speaking at school. My parents knew the parishioners of St Thomas are a very forgiving people.

I was trained by the lector coordinator at the time, and assigned to my first Mass on a Labor Day Weekend in 2006 (when attendance at Mass is generally low.) To say I was nervous would be a huge understatement. I was shaking so badly I just knew I could not do it. I know my parents and Father Midura were rather nervous as well. I went up to the ambo and bent down to pull out the bench to stand on, and the paper I was to read from was blown off the Ambo by the fan. Not a great start. Deacon Bob quickly grabbed the paper for me. I began the reading, and have continued for seven years. It took a month or so before I was comfortable, and yes, it absolutely helped me in school. But that is not the reason I continue. I continue because St Thomas is a part of who I am, and I continue because it means something very special to me and my parents.

I continue so I can honor Father Midura who always had the utmost confidence in me. St Thomas is my parish

family and while I may not know everyone's name, I know the faces each week and that is very comforting. I hope that when I lector I convey not only the Word of God, but also convey the love I have for my parish.
