FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A man was doing his Ph.D. in philosophy. His wife realized how seriously he was taking his studies and one day she asked him, "Why is it you love me so much?"

Quick as a shot he replied, "When you say "so much," are you referring to intensity, depth, frequency, quality, or duration?"

Can love be dissected into explainable elements?...By dissecting its petals, no one ever delighted in the beauty of the rose.

This week is the feast of the Epiphany. Jesus reveals God's divinity in his humanity to the three wise men from the east. From their three gifts (gold, frankincense and myrrh), it is said that they understood this baby Jesus to be God, King and Savior. What must have gone through their minds when they saw this King, God and Savior in a human child, of a poor and simple

couple Mary and Joseph?

Revelation of Jesus did not happen in a way we would expect a God, a King or a Savior to appear. Jesus chose a simple way, through ordinary people living in regular living conditions. The hearts which are open to God would recognize this. The hearts which associate divine revelation with the extraordinary or the people who try to humanly rationalize divine revelation would miss it.

God's revelation takes place always in all places and persons in the way God chooses. God's revelation is available to those who are open to the ways of God. An open heart is a loving heart which seeks to receive the signals of revelation sent from God. It is not like a rational mind which expects divine revelation in the way it wants. Epiphany asks us to have an open and loving heart to receive God's revelation, not a closed and confined mind.

Catholics for Freedom of Religion:



The Archdiocese of New York hailed as a victory a recent Federal District Court ruling granting a federal injunction that blocks an Obama administration requirement to provide contraceptive care, under the ACA, to employees at its nonprofit affiliates. The ruling found that the regulation violated the religious freedom of these groups. However, the US Justice Department may appeal this decision (NY Times, 12/16/13).

The mission of CFFR is to educate and advocate for our First Amendment guarantee of Freedom of Religion which is presently being challenged under the Affordable Care Act, in schools, and in businesses.

ALTAR SERVER MINISTRY

When asked to write this article, one of the suggested questions to answer was "What brought you to join this ministry?" Originally, it was guilt. My boys were altar servers and they would be scheduled together as Masses two or three times per month. They could not always serve at the same time, so we would try to get someone to cover their assignment. That didn't always work out, but since they had other commitments, the Mass would go on without one, sometimes both of them. This used to bother me.

I talked it over with my husband and we decided to divide and conquer. If one (or both) of the boys had another obligation, he would take them to whatever Mass they would be available for, and I signed up to be an altar server so I could cover for one of them.

As I became an active part of preparing the table of the Lord's Feast, it felt very different than just sitting in the pew and listening. I felt like I was making a difference by helping the priest and deacons during the celebration.

In October 2012 I was honored when asked to assume the responsibility of scheduling the servers. Although it is an ongoing challenge working around school and sports schedules, it is so inspiring to watch the young people actively participate in the weekly celebrations.
