**A reading from the Holy Gospel according to
Matthew:**

When Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee. He left Nazareth and went to live in Capernaum by the sea, in the region of Zebulun and Naphtali, that what had been said through Isaiah the prophet might be fulfilled:

Land of Zebulun and land of Naphtali,

the way to the sea, beyond the Jordan,

Galilee of the Gentiles,

the people who sit in darkness have seen a great light,

on those dwelling in a land overshadowed by death

light has arisen.

From that time on, Jesus began to preach and say,

“Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.”

As he was walking by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon who is called Peter, and his brother Andrew, casting a net into the sea; they were fishermen. He said to them, “Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.”

At once they left their nets and followed him. He walked along from there and saw two other brothers, James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John. They were in a boat, with their father Zebedee, mending their nets. He called them, and immediately they left their boat and their father and followed him.

He went around all of Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom, and curing every disease and illness among the people.

1. Name an experience when you felt that God was trying to get your attention.
2. Relate a time when you witnessed light and healing.
3. What does the kingdom of God mean to you? How does it affect your life?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

“Nothing improves a person’s driving skills like the sudden discovery that his license has expired.” These words remind us that having a valid license does not mean a skillful driver. License is not a guarantee that we will never cause or meet with any accidents. A license is a privilege to drive even though we are not all perfect drivers. The drivers who are aware of the weakness and carelessness of both themselves and others will do better driving than those who claim the right to drive because they have a license to drive. **In today’s Gospel John the Baptist** knows his limitation as the prophet whose job it is just to introduce Jesus and nothing more. We need to take time now to consider the accomplishments of this past year, and see how we can improve for the coming year... and here in Outreach, we are overwhelmed by the generosity of our parishioners who made our end-of-the-year efforts so successful! The spirit of giving, and of love for others was so evident that we just feel grateful. There are so many children and suffering people who feel that people care about them...we are thanked and blessed on a daily basis by the people who need us. And it is you, the people who are reading this bulletin, who make it possible for this chain of events to happen. Can we improve? We can all be just a little more caring, a little more accepting of those in our community who aren't as fortunate as some of us, and put ourselves in their shoes for a moment. It doesn't take much to change our circumstances; a lost job, an illness, or the death of a spouse. Be aware of what happens to your neighbors, and help them before they need to come to an Outreach such as ours.

Although our recent drive for food and toys was successful, we need to remember that in the difficult cold and snowy days ahead, the clients who come to Outreach are very stressed at this time of year especially, and need our help even more. Living in a room at a shelter with young children, unable to go out in inclement weather, or perhaps even without a car, young families struggle on a daily basis. Without adequate food, the struggle is even harder. So as you do your grocery shopping, please consider our Outreach pantry and throw in a few items for these people who could be any of us under other circumstances. Perishable food can be brought to Outreach (across the street from St. Thomas More at the Religious Ed. Center) from 10 – 2 Monday through Thursday, and non-perishable food can be dropped off in the bins in the Church lobby or at Outreach. Thank you.
