A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, Mary and Joseph took Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of the Lord,

He came in the Spirit into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to perform the custom of the law in regard to him, he took him into his arms and blessed God, saying:

“Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in the sight of all the peoples: a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel.”

Focus Questions:

1. Mary, Joseph, Simeon and Anna were touched by God coming directly into their lives. Relate an experience when you encountered God in your life.

2. Simeon told Mary that a sword would pierce her heart. Describe a sorrow you carried in your heart.

3. Simeon and Anna are the last of a number of older people who were part of the birth of Jesus (like Zechariah and Elizabeth, Joseph, the wise men and shepherds). Who were the older people in your childhood who helped you get a start in life?

Simeon and Anna spend their lives in prayer. Talk about the importance of prayer and what you can do to make it more and more a part of your life.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

“We do not come to grace; grace comes to us.”

These words of M. Scott Peck explain this Sunday's Gospel in a brighter light. The Gospel narrates how Jesus began His public ministry. He proclaimed that the kingdom of God has come. He also called disciples to continue His work of God's Kingdom.

Jesus' world was no better than ours. There was poverty, political oppression from Romans, exploitation by religious authorities, social discrimination, inequality at all levels and other such problems of a colony nation. Jesus did not begin His ministry as a reformer but as a spiritual leader, calling people to a new awareness of something good that is already

present in spite of and in the midst of all problems.

His focus and call was to make people live the reality of God's kingdom in the midst of human oppressive authorities of religion and politics. His way of reforming society was to make the evil disappear with good. He appeals to the people that the grace of God's Kingdom has already come. All they have to do is to live the Grace. **We need not go in search of grace.** Grace has come already to live with us. Jesus calls each of us as He called the first disciples. He is awakening us to live the divine grace that is already at work in His coming. Our readiness to live the call and the grace of Jesus is Jesus' way of solving the social, political and religious problems. We are called to always to believe that whatever good or bad fortune may come our way we can always give it meaning and transform it into something of Kingdom value – value of God's grace.

Our grateful thanks to Roberto and Michelle Strollo who very generously hosted the Wine Taster, a fund-raising event for our parish on Sunday, January 19th, 2014 at 3:00 pm in Walden Hall. I appreciate the participants who brought a dish. It was a fun filled evening. Our mission: to help people incorporate St. Thomas More Parish Outreach and the St. Thomas St. Vincent de Paul Conference.

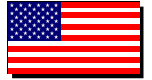


Although our recent drive for food and toys was successful, we need to remember that in the difficult cold and snowy days ahead, the clients who come to Outreach are very stressed at this time of year especially, and need our help even more. Living in a room at a shelter with young children, unable to go out in inclement weather, or perhaps even without a car, young families struggle on a daily basis. Without adequate food, the struggle is even harder. So as you do your grocery shopping, please consider our Outreach pantry and throw in a few items for these people who could be any of us under other circumstances. Perishable food can be brought to Outreach (across the street from St. Thomas More at the Religious Ed. Center) from 10 – 2 Monday through Thursday, and non-perishable food can be dropped off in the bins in the Church lobby or at Outreach. Thank you.

As the weather gets even more unpredictable, please take a moment and check on the most vulnerable members of our community: the sick, the frail, and the elderly. Give them a call to check up on them; make sure they have their medication, their food, or any other assistance they might need at this time. They would find comfort just in the call, even if nothing else is needed.

the Obama administration HHS mandate alone.
