A new injunction from the entire U.S. Supreme Court will protect the Little Sisters of the Poor from the fines they would have incurred from the demands of the HHS mandate while the RELIGION group's case works its way through the court system.

In addition, the injunction protects more than 400 other Catholic organizations working with the sisters' religious health-benefit provider, Christian Brothers Services, which is also a plaintiff in the case.

"Virtually every other party who asked for protection from the mandate has been given it," said Becket Fund for Religious Liberty. "It made no sense for the Little Sisters to be singled out for fines and punishment ..." (by Catholic News Agency, 1/25/14)


