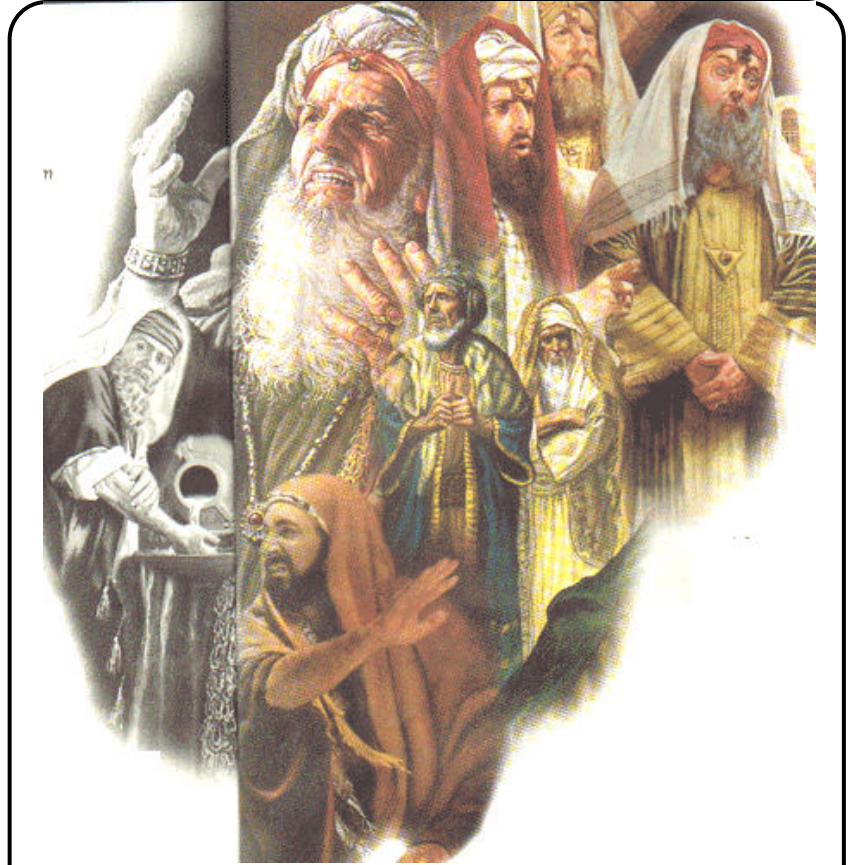

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

Jesus said to his disciples:

“You have heard that it was said,

An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.

But I say to you, offer no resistance to one who is evil.

When someone strikes you on your right cheek, turn the

other one as well. If anyone wants to go to law with you

over your tunic, hand over your cloak as well. Should

anyone press you into service for one mile, go for two

miles. Give to the one who asks of you, and do not turn

your back on one who wants to borrow.

“You have heard that it was said,

You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.

But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those

who persecute you, that you may be children of your

heavenly Father, for he makes his sun rise on the bad and

the good, and causes rain to fall on the just and the unjust.

For if you love those who love you, what recompense will

you have? Do not the tax collectors do the same? And if

you greet your brothers only, what is unusual about that?

Do not the pagans do the same? So be perfect, just as your

heavenly Father is perfect.”

1. Relate a time when someone went the extra mile for you. How did that make you feel?

2. Relate a time when you showed kindness to someone even though they may have hurt or disrespected you.

3. Describe a time when you freely gave to others.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

In a small town a man dialed 016 for directory information. A woman's voice at the other end said, "I'm sorry, you have to dial 015 for that."

It seemed to him, when he had dialed 015, that he was hearing the same voice at the other end. So he said, "Aren't you the lady I spoke to a while ago?"

"I am," said the voice. "I'm doing both jobs today."

It is our personal choice to lead a life either according to the letter of the law, or in the spirit of it. The literal law will reduce our life merely to a bunch of events done mechanically, but the spirit of the law will liberate us to build relationships with each other. The purpose

of the law is not merely to dictate what to do and what not to do. Laws are made to set the inner spirit in the direction of living life in its fullness.

Today's Gospel is from the Sermon on the Mount.

Jesus explains how to fulfill the law. He increases the demand of the law in order to live the spirit of the law. For example, the literal observance of the law 'thou shall not kill' is not to be involved in any murderous act. But the spirit of the law means not merely to avoid killing, but to promote opportunities of living. Thus the spirit of this law 'thou shall not kill' does not encourage anything - even anger or yelling - that would hinder the opportunity of living. The literal observance of any law reduces human living to a mechanical act. Trying to live the spirit of the law liberates life and uplifts humans to live in loving relationships.

Evangelii Gaudium which means 'Joy of the Gospel' is the Apostolic Exhortation of the Holy Father Francis.

This is his first papal letter, very pastoral, inviting and inclusive in spirit and eye-opening in its presentation. The ministry of Peace and Justice of our parish is arranging a group study of this letter on the mornings of Lenten Tuesdays (March 4, 11, 18, 25) after the 9:00 am Mass, and on the evenings of Lenten Thursdays (March 6, 13, 20 and 27) from 7:00pm to 8:00pm. I will introduce each session for discussion. All are welcome. If you plan to attend, please bring a copy of the papal letter "Evangelii Gaudium" which you can download from the internet.

Recently, there was news about a snowstorm that hit Atlanta, Georgia, and paralyzed the city; children couldn’t get home from school, parents couldn’t get to their children, or get home, for that matter. Those in charge did not cope well with the situation. Compare that to our own scenario on Long Island; we have had much snow in the last month, but we were able to cope with its effect on our lives. Think

about how little we should be complaining, then, in comparison to the citizens of Georgia. How grateful we should be, that we are warm most of the time, and comfortable. Of course, the clients of Outreach would be hard pressed to call themselves “comfortable”; that is why we need to help them to sustain their self-respect, their dignity, and their hope. Please help in whatever way you can, by donating meat or chicken, canned goods, pasta, cereal, etc. and bringing the items to the Church lobby or to Outreach from Monday through Thursday, from 10:00 – 2:00. Thank you.

Rabbi Lord Jonathan Sacks, Emeritus Chief Rabbi of the United Hebrew Congregations of the Commonwealth, is a leader in the defense of religious liberty. "The world is very different

now. For man holds in his mortal hands the power to abolish all forms of human poverty and all forms of human life. And yet, the same revolutionary beliefs for which our forebears fought are still at issue around the globe - the belief that the rights of man come not from the generosity of the state, but from the hand of God."

Pope Benedict XVI would concur with his own concerns about religious liberty. He wrote, "The spirit of our age is profoundly secular and secularism accepts religion - if it accepts it at all - only on its own terms. Under this view, religion is subordinated to the political interests of the secular state and it is precisely this subordination of religion to the state that the First Amendment seeks to prevent."

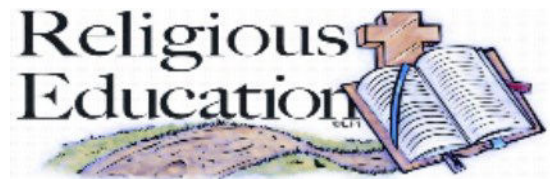
