
MARRIAGE—As soon as a couple decides to marry, and BEFORE making any other arrangements, call the Church Office to schedule an appointment with one of the deacons.

Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

March 2, 2014
Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Isaiah 49:14-15
Psalm 62: 2-3, 6-7, 8-9

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

Jesus said to his disciples:

"No one can serve two masters. He will either hate one and love the other, or be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon.

"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds in the sky; they do not sow or reap, they gather nothing into barns, yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are not you more important than they? Can any of you by worrying add a single moment to your life-span? Why are you anxious about clothes? Learn from the way the wild flowers grow. They do not work or spin. But I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendor was clothed like one of them. If God so clothes the grass of the field, which grows today and is thrown into the oven tomorrow, will he not much more provide for you, O you of little faith? So do not worry and say, 'What are we to eat?' or 'What are we to drink?' or 'What are we to wear?' All these things the pagans seek. Your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given you besides. Do not worry about tomorrow; tomorrow will take care of itself. Sufficient for a day is its own evil."

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A mother asked her friend "What is the surest way to get my son to write a letter to me?" Her fried replied "Write him a letter saying here's \$100. Spend it any way you like."

"And that will make my son write home?" asked the mother. Her friend replied, "Yes indeed when you forget to enclose the money!"

When the son writes a letter with care and love for his mom he becomes the author of an act of writing the letter. But when his mom's letter without \$ 100 makes him write a letter to her, he reacts to the fact that her letter was without the \$100. He does not act but reacts.

When we act, we live our life fully well. We become the author of our life. When we react, we only respond to what influences/induces us from outside. Our life becomes only a reaction and not a pure action. Action makes us live our true selves. Reaction makes us live our induced selves.

Today's readings teach us to be persons of pure acts that originate from within us. The first reading encourages us that we can be holy as God is holy. This means we can be as God is - original and pure in our act of living. We need not imitate or be induced by anyone or anything outside of us.

In the Gospel reading Jesus asks us not to react even against our enemies. Evil, vengeance, enmity or hatred can exist only where there is reaction. Evil does not have its own existence because it is a reaction rather than a pure action.

In the person of pure action, love and holiness begin to blossom naturally. Forgiving and praying for an enemy is not an easy thing as long as one does not change from the way of reaction. Loving and praying for an enemy is possible only when we begin to live our life as a pure and uninfluenced act as God acts. God forgives because God acts. God acts, not reacts, and that is why God causes the sun to rise on the bad as well as the good, and rain to fall on the honest and dishonest alike.

There is parking for disabled persons by the curb near front entrance of the Church. But some park their cars in undesignated place by the opposite curb near the front entrance. Thus cars are parked on both sides of the road leaving a narrow space to carefully get through to the parking area. With snow and ice everywhere parking by the undesignated curb makes it difficult for drivers to drop off people and then proceed to the parking area. So I request all those who park in the undesignated areas not to do so. Please consider the safety and convenient flow of traffic.

Mardi Gras celebration on Sunday-- March 5 is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. We know that the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday is Mardi Gras (Grey/Fat Tuesday). But as a parish family we will celebrate Mardi Gras on March 2nd, the Sunday before Ash Wednesday. Come, have your last big Sunday breakfast before Lent served after all masses. Our Parish High School Youth Ministry is happy to host this event with Pancakes, Waffles, French Toast, Eggs, Sausage, Hash Browns and unlimited Coffee. Spread the news and bring your family. Evangeli Gaudium which means 'Joy of the Gospel' is the Apostolic exhortation of the Holy Father Francis. The Supreme Court will hear CATHOLICS arguments on March 25 in the case of family owned businesses, Hobby Lobby RELIGION (arts-&-crafts) and Conestoga Wood (cabinet maker). At issue will be First

Amendment arguments that the ACA contraception mandate to provide abortion inducing drugs violates the owners Free Exercise rights and rights under the Religious Freedom Restoration Act of 1993. The governments' reasoning is that these individuals' rights cannot be exercised through their family-owned businesses.

"The filing demonstrates in no uncertain terms that the government's efforts to strip this family business of its religious rights represent a gross violation of the Religious Freedom Restoration Act and the First Amendment", said Becket Fund counsel. "We are hopeful the Supreme Court will uphold the 10th Circuits strong affirmation of the (individuals) rights to live out their deeply held beliefs in every aspect of their business."(National Catholic Reporter, 2/12/14)


