FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

"How many cups of coffee will this hold?" the man asked as he placed a large thermos on the lunch-room counter. "Six cups," advised the waitress.

"Fine," replied the man handing over the thermos. "Give me two cups regular, two cups black, and two with extra cream." **We know that the coffee in the thermos** will not have the taste of any of the coffees the man ordered. Of course there are three types of coffee in there, but at the same time there is really no type of coffee in there. Mixing everything is good, but not at the risk of losing one's identity. Life is not syncretism but harmony. Life is a wonderful painting; each color has its own place and proportion without losing its character and beauty. **In today's Gospel Jesus says** that we cannot serve both God and mammon. Our thermos cannot mix hot and cold together well. In the same way, God and mammon cannot be ruling us at the same time. We will neither be of God nor of wealth to live free of God's care.

Jesus wants us to serve God who cares for even the birds and wild flowers of the field. God is our master. All that we say and do, think and feel will have the flavor and expression of God's will. We become the beautiful art work of God the painter. All the colors of our living moments will harmoniously blend to bear witness to God's love. All our relations and possessions will become the channels of God's grace both to our individual selves and to others.

March 5 is Ash Wednesday when we start the season of Lent. Lent is the time we try to see our life's blessings and pain, especially our pains with spiritual eyes. The forty days of Lent are a big spiritual exercise to view ourselves and understand our priceless identity as Jesus would do. I ardently invite you to avail yourselves to make use of the spiritual exercises the parish offers. You may have received the Lenten Calendar in our bulk mailing which lists all our spiritual activities. For example we will have community morning prayer every day at 8:45 followed by the 9:00 am mass. Every Friday evening the Stations of the Cross will be prayed for special intentions. This Friday March 7th we will pray for Children who live in challenging situations.

Another spiritual exercise is "Evangeli Gaudium" which means Joy of the Gospel, and is the Apostolic Exhortation of the Holy Father Francis - very pastoral, inviting and inclusive in spirit, and eye-opening in its presentation. The ministry of Justice and Peace of our parish is arranging a group study of this letter on Lenten Tuesday mornings (March 4, 11, 18, 25) after 9:00 am Mass, and from 7 to 8 in the evenings of Lenten Thursdays (March 6, 13, 20 and 27). I will introduce each session for discussion. All are welcome. If you plan to attend, please bring a copy of the papal letter which you can download from the internet. 
