

# FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Jim got into a bus and found himself sitting next to a young man who was looking shabby and homeless. He was wearing only one shoe.

"You've evidently lost a shoe, son" said Jim. "No, man" came the reply. "I found one." The moral of the story is this: what is evident to someone does not mean it is the truth.

In the Gospel today, the tempter (Satan) proposes to Jesus what he must evidently do after fasting for forty days. It is evident that Jesus needs to eat, and he does has the power to change stone into bread. But, though it is evident, it is not the whole truth. Using his power just to appease his hunger is to reduce himself to bodily hunger. But it was more evident to Jesus that there is another hunger for God in him, which is a result from the spiritual exercise of fasting for 40 days. That is why he replies to the tempter 'One does not live by bread alone but by every word that comes forth from the mouth of God.'

Life does not comprise of appeasing bodily hunger alone. Life has a deep spiritual hunger too. We are not just a physical body. We are created after God's image. We carry within us something precious of God. Lent is the time we are called to experience that Godly precious thing in us.

All Lenten exercises such as, fasting, praying, giving alms, abstaining from meat on Fridays, Stations of the Cross, the Lenten Mission in April, attending mass etc. are all spiritual moments when we avail ourselves to experience this Godly precious thing in us. Let Lent serve as a wake-up call to a spiritual experience of the Godly identity in us.

**The Stations of the Cross is prayed every Friday at 7:00 pm for different intentions.** This Friday, March 14 we pray for those looking for employment and struggling to make ends meet, for hose who live in debt and for those who suffer because of jobs without any benefits. On Friday, April 11<sup>th</sup> we will have a soup supper at 6:00pm followed by Stations of the Cross.

One of our special Lenten spiritual exercise is the Lenten Mission on the weekend of April 4-5. Please see the flyer in this bulletin.

**Please remember that this Tuesday, March 11<sup>th</sup>** after the 9:00am mass and on **Thursday, March 13<sup>th</sup>** at 7:00pm, we will gather for the study of Pope Francis's letter, 'Joy of the Gospel' hosted by the ministry of Justice and Peace.

Every Lent our parish does a Lenten project of helping the poor by our financial contribution. This year I request our parish to help my home diocese in Coimbatore, India. Last September when I spent my vacation with my mom in India, I had the opportunity to visit the Cathedral parish where I was ordained a priest and where I served as an associate for two years. The township ordered the cathedral church built by French missionaries 150 years ago to be pulled down as the building was no longer safe. The congregation had to worship in a tent which held 300 people while the rest had to stand outside the tent throughout the entire mass. The parishioners along with their pastor and bishop have requested our help to build the new church. You can view some pictures in the Narthex of the present tent-church and people at work. I felt that as my home diocese is generous to share me, their priest, for our spiritual needs here, we can share with them a little of what we can afford as a sign of our generosity towards them.
