

# Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

March 23, 2014 Third Sunday of Lent Exodus 17: 3-7 Psalm 95:1-2, 6-7, 8-9 Romans 5:1-2, 5-8 John 4:5-15, 19B-26, 39A, 40-42

### A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

Jesus came to a town of Samaria called Sychar, near the plot of land that Jacob had given to his son Joseph. Jacob's well was there. Jesus, tired from his journey, sat down there at the well. It was about noon. A woman of Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink." His disciples had gone into the town to buy food. The Samaritan woman said to him, "How can you, a Jew, ask me, a Samaritan woman, for a drink?" —For Jews use nothing in common with Samaritans. - Jesus answered and said to her, "If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, 'Give me a drink, ' you would have asked him and he would have given you living water." The woman said to him, "Sir, you do not even have a bucket and the cistern is deep; where then can you get this living water? Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us this cistern and drank from it himself with his children and his flocks?" Jesus answered and said to her, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again; but whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst; the water I shall give will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life." The woman said to him, "Sir, give me this water, so that I may not be thirsty or have to keep coming here to draw water.

"I can see that you are a prophet. Our ancestors worshiped on this mountain; but you people say that the place to worship is in Jerusalem." Jesus said to her, "Believe me, woman, the hour is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. You people worship what you do not understand; we worship what we understand, because salvation is from the Jews. But the hour is coming, and is now here, when true worshipers will worship the Father in Spirit and truth; and indeed the Father seeks such people to worship him. God is Spirit, and those who worship him must worship in Spirit and truth." The woman said to him, "I know that the Messiah is coming, the one called the Christ; when he comes, he will tell us everything." Jesus said to her, "I am he, the one who is speaking Many of the Samaritans of that town began to believe in him. When the Samaritans came to him, they invited him to stay with them; and he stayed there two days. Many more began to believe in him because of his word, and they said to the woman, "We no longer believe because of your word; for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the savior of the world."

### FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

The beggar walked up to a man and said, "Sir, would you let me have a hundred dollars for a cup of coffee?"

"One hundred dollars!" screamed the man. "My good fellow, that is ridiculous!"

Growing indignant, the beggar said, "Give me a yes or no, fella, but don't tell me how to run my business!"

We want God to grant our prayers. But are we ready for God to design our life? Or is our prayer, "Give me God what I ask for but don't tell me how to

live my life?" In the second reading Paul instructs his disciple Timothy to live his life with the grace (strength) of God and according to God's design (purpose/plan). The God who has created us has a purpose for each of us. The God who created us never abandons us but showers upon us the grace (power) we need to live that purpose for which we were put on earth.

The Gospel narrates how Jesus was transfigured shining in His glory. When does one shine in one's glory? Whenever one fulfills the purpose of God with God's power, that person shines in glory. Jesus is the perfect manifestation of living God's purpose with God's power. Both times while Jesus lived his most popular time as a powerful preacher and a wondrous worker, and at the shameful hour on the Cross, Jesus lived those moments to express God's purpose and to manifest God's grace/power.

The aim of our Lenten spiritual practices is make us aware that each one of us is not here by accident or by chance but we are here by God's purpose and for which we are empowered by his divine grace.

The Stations of the Cross is prayed every Friday at 7:00 pm for a particular intention. This Friday March 21 we pray for those who are impacted by unforeseen events, such as a car accident, the sudden death of a beloved friend or a family member, a house fire and other challenges of life.

On Friday, April 11<sup>th</sup> we will have a soup supper at 6:00pm followed by Stations of the Cross.

One of the special spiritual exercises during Lent is our Lenten Mission starting on the weekend of April 4 and 5. Please see the flyer in this bulletin.

### <u>Lenten Project – St. Michael's Cathedral Church</u>, <u>Coimbatore</u>, India – The Church of my Ordination.

Every Lent our parish does a Lenten project of helping the poor by our financial contribution. This year I request the parish to help my home diocese in Coimbatore, India. Last September when I spent my vacation with my mom in India, I had the opportunity to visit the Cathedral parish where I was ordained a priest and served as an associate for two years. The township issued an order to pull down the cathedral church built by French missionaries 150 years ago as it was not safe anymore to worship. The masses and services were celebrated in a tent, which held 300 worshipers and the rest of the congregation stood outside the tent throughout the entire mass.

The parishioners along with their pastor and bishop requested our help to build the new Church. You can view some of the pictures of the present tent-church and people at work in the Narthex. The Catholics in India are just 1.5% of the total population. The parishioners of this Cathedral church need close to 3 million dollars to build the Cathedral both for their parish and for the bigger

congregations during diocesan celebrations. Being few in number and not financially strong to meet the costs. they extend their hands to us for help.

I felt that as my home diocese is generous to share me, their priest, with us for our spiritual needs here, we can share with them a little of what we can afford as a sign of our generosity towards them. Please consider this Lenten Project. I recommend you my people to help the people of Coimbatore, who continue to be my people since 1982. I will fill you with various other details about this project in the forthcoming bulletins.



# MINISTRY MATTERS STEWARDSHIP AT ST THOMAS MORE

### Faith & Light Ministry

Faith and Light is an international organization which celebrates the gifts of our friends who have special needs, their caregivers, and families. It is an offshoot of L'Arche, an international organization of residential communities founded by Jean Vanier with the same goals and mission. L'Arche is residential; Faith & Light is a prayer group, meeting once a month. Although born at the heart of the Roman Catholic Church, they are ecumenical movements. They are founded on the conviction that persons with an intellectual disability have been touched by God to confound the wise and the strong. Their spirit is the spirit of the Gospel, the spirit of compassion and acceptance of human suffering. Each Faith & Light community wants to be inserted in the parish or the parishes of its members. It thus is the sign that the most vulnerable persons, and often the most rejected, are at the heart of the Church.

Our son, John Paul, was born with Down Syndrome. He is now 35 years old and lives in a residential group home. The one thing which the group home lacks is an ability to provide for his spiritual growth and an opportunity to share his strong faith with his peers and his friends. We have long been admirers of Jean Vanier and his spiritual writings and the ideas and goals of L'Arche and Faith & Light. So in January 2010, we invited national Faith & Light leaders to our parish for a training day to form a Faith & Light in this area.

There were people from all over Long Island at the meeting, and we decided with members of St. Thomas More and nearby parishes to start a Faith & Light group in this area. We originally met at a few nearby parishes, but settled on a meeting each first Friday of the month at Holy Cross Parish in Nesconset. At our community meeting, we all seek to worship together united as brothers and sisters in Christ. We sing together, listen to talks, participate in mimes of stories from the Bible; we pray together and end with refreshments and fellowship. Faith and Light believes that the person who is weak and disabled can become a source of unity in society and in each Church as well as between Churches and nations. We have also participated in group events like picnics

and pilgrimages with other Faith & Light groups. We join in diocesan events such as the Mass and luncheon here at St. Thomas More every October.

What is most amazing to us is the depth of spirituality in the people in our group who are disabled. There is no question of who the leaders of our group are because their sharing is the most inspirational, their prayers the most focused on others, their compassion most visible to all of us. We continue to grow. There are three Faith & Light groups on Long Island and the possibility of forming two more groups. Come join us on the first Friday of any month at 7 PM at Holy Cross in Nesconset!
