BAPTISM—As soon as your child is born, please call the Parish Office to make Baptism arrangements. Preparation session and welcoming Mass attendance are required.


MARRIAGE—As soon as a couple decides to marry, and BEFORE making any other arrangements, call the Church Office to schedule an appointment with one of the deacons.

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

The sisters of Lazarus sent word to Jesus, saying, "Master, the one you love is ill." When Jesus heard this he said, "This illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it." Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus. So when he heard that he was ill, he remained for two days in the place where he was. Then after this he said to his disciples, "Let us go back to Judea."

When Jesus arrived, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went to meet him; but Mary sat at home. Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But even now I know that whatever you ask of God, God will give you." Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise." Martha said, "I know he will rise, in the resurrection on the last day." Jesus told her, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" She said to him, "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world."

He became perturbed and deeply troubled, and said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to him, "Sir, come and see." And Jesus wept. So the Jews said, "See how he loved him." But some of them said, "Could not the one who opened the eyes of the blind man have done something so that this man would not have died?"

So Jesus, perturbed again, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone lay across it. Jesus said, "Take away the stone." Martha, the dead man's sister, said to him, "Lord, by now there will be a stench; he has been dead for four days." Jesus said to her, "Did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?" So they took away the stone. And Jesus raised his eyes and said, "Father, I thank you for hearing me. I know that you always hear me; but because of the crowd here I have said this, that they may believe that you sent me." And when he had said this, He cried out in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" The dead man came out, tied hand and foot with burial bands, and his face was wrapped in a cloth. So Jesus said to them, "Untie him and let him go." Now many of the Jews who had come to Mary and seen what he had done began to believe in him.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends.

Jim is in the catering business. He says business is terrific. In fact, he said that he now has enough money to last him the rest of his life – as long as he dies by next Tuesday. Money has only limited light to brighten the dark moments of life. Like money, any other measurable entities like popularity, beauty, health etc., can brighten our life until they wear out, deplete and vanish. Depending on them as a source of life amounts to groping in the darkness. For they are lifeless objects and blind forces. They have neither the light to lead us nor the life to revive us.

In today's Gospel Jesus opens the eyes of the man born blind. The story tells us how he gradually comes to believe Jesus. On the other hand, the religious authorities who have perfect eye sight, gradually come to reject Jesus. Having physical eye sight does not mean that one sees and relates with other persons in the way one should. If one chooses to see through the eye of money, that person will be seen as an occasion of either making or losing money. Our eye sight is determined by whatever we take as a light to illuminate our life. Jesus opens our life to the real and true light that will lead and revive us for a life here on earth and after for eternity. Jesus is our Light. In his light we will expel the darkness and see the true way and clear vision of our life.

In order to set the mood for this theme, at 6:00 pm we will start with only soup as our evening meal so as to be united with those who suffer hunger. Then at 7:00 pm we will turn our experience of hunger into praying the Stations for those who hunger. All are welcome. <u>Lenten Project – St. Michael's Cathedral Church</u>, <u>Coimbatore</u>, India – The Church of my Ordination.

This year I request the parish to help my home diocese in Coimbatore, India. Last September when I spent my vacation with my mom in India, I had the opportunity to visit the Cathedral parish where I was ordained a priest and served as an associate for two years. The township issued an order to pull down the cathedral church built by French missionaries 150 years ago as it was not safe in which to worship anymore. The masses and services were celebrated in a tent, which held 300 worshipers and the rest of the congregation stood outside the tent throughout the entire mass.

The parishioners along with their pastor and bishop have requested our help to build the new Church. You can

view some pictures in the narthex of the present tentchurch and people at work. The Catholics in India are just 1.5% of the population. The parishioners of this Cathedral church need close to 3 million dollars to build the Cathedral both for their parish and for the bigger congregations during diocesan celebrations. Being few in number and financially not strong enough to meet the cost, they extend their hands to us for help.

I felt that as my home diocese is generous to share me, their priest, with us for our spiritual needs here, we can share with them a little of what we can afford as a sign of our generosity towards them. Please consider this Lenten Project. I recommend you my people to help them, who continue to be my people since 1982.

If you are willing to volunteer, please know that your commitment is for this event only If you are interested in helping us, please call the rectory. The recently formed Catholic Benefits Association, a coalition of nearly 200 Catholic dioceses, agencies, and businesses, filed a class action lawsuit on March 12 in Oklahoma Federal Court, to block enforcement of the HHS Mandate

that requires them to provide health insurance

coverage for contraceptive drugs, abortifacients, and surgical sterilizations. The lawsuit said the regulations under ACA are discriminatory because some religious entities and ministries are exempt while others are not. (Catholic News Service, 3/13/14)
