BAPTISM—As soon as your child is born, please call the Parish Office to make Baptism arrangements. Preparation session and welcoming Mass attendance are required.


MARRIAGE—As soon as a couple decides to marry, and BEFORE making any other arrangements, call the Church Office to schedule an appointment with one of the deacons.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

The prison warden told the condemned man to order whatever he wanted for his last meal, and he offered suggestions: "Lobster, Filet Mignon, Beef Wellington, Caviar or Shrimp?" "No," the prisoner said. "I will just take a bowl of mushrooms." "Why mushrooms?" the warden asked him. "I've always been afraid to eat them" said the prisoner. Death is the ultimate fear. Once that fear is overcome any other fear can be easily faced.

In the Gospel today Jesus empowers us to face death. In the person of Lazarus Jesus demonstrates that one who believes in Him will overcome death by rising from death. Jesus is the Resurrection and the Life. The one who believes in Him will never die, but will live forever. That is to say, death may happen to the believer but cannot take life away from that person. Death does not have power to end the believer's life. Belief in Jesus makes death powerless. Whoever believes in Jesus, even if they die, will live and everyone who lives and believes in Jesus will never die. (John 11:25-26).

If we sincerely and seriously believe in Jesus, we are liberated from the ultimate fear – fear of death – then we must be able to handle every other fear of our life by the liberating power of believing in Jesus. Jesus, the victor of death, is the one who

lives in us and He will make us overcome all fears.

You can view some of the pictures of the present tent -church and people at work in the Narthex. The Catholics in India are just 1.5% of the population. The parishioners of this Cathedral church need closer to 3 million dollars to build the Cathedral both for their parish and for the bigger congregations during diocesan celebrations. Being few in number and financially not strong enough to meet the cost, they extend their hands to us for help.

I felt that as my home diocese is generous to share me, their priest, with us for our spiritual need

here, we can share with them a little of what we can afford as a sign of our generosity towards them, to build their Church where I was ordained as Priest. Please consider this Lenten Project. I recommend you my people to help them, who continue to be my people since 1982.

Our Parish Outreach is preparing the Easter Baskets and Easter Dinner for the poor and needy of our Parish. Please support them to help the poor. Catholic Charities of Atlanta and Catholic Education of North Georgia, which runs 5 Catholic Schools, won a victory for religious freedom this week when a federal judge ruled that they do not have

to comply with the HHS contraceptive mandate. In his decision, District Judge W. Duffey ruled that the Obama administration is not permitted to enforce the mandate as it would violate the Religious Freedom Restoration Act of 1993, which prohibits the government from burdening an individual's religious practice. On March 25, the Supreme Court heard arguments regarding whether or not Hobby Lobby, a private business, has the right to run its business according to the religious convictions of its owners.
