## Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

April 20, 2014
Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord
Acts of the Apostles 10:34a, 37-43
Psalm 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23
Colossians 3:1-4 Or: 1 Corinthians 5:6b-8
John 20:1-9

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

- 2. Peter believed when he saw the empty tomb. Relate a time when you believed only after seeing.
- 3. How do you live each day as a believer in the Risen Lord?

#### FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Michael Angelo was asked by his friend, "How could you sculpture such master pieces out of rough rocks?" He answered, "I see in marble stones hidden sculptures inviting me to bring them out by my chisel." God is the excellent skilful artist who sees the best sculpture sitting inside of us to be chiseled out. We are created after God's image. We bear God's image in us. If we allow God the Artist to work on us we will shine as God's wonderful work of art.

We begin Holy Week with Palm Sunday. Holy Week commemorates the events that happened to Jesus during the last week of His earthly life. Palm Sunday celebrates how people saw Jesus as their Messiah entering the city of Jerusalem. Holy Thursday is the Last Supper in which Jesus offered His presence in the form of Bread and Wine – the Eucharist. Good Friday, Jesus died on the Cross expressing God's incredible love for us. Holy Saturday evening we will celebrate the vigil of Jesus' Resurrection from death.

The events of Holy Week show us how God chiseled the best sculpture in Jesus. In Jesus, God reveals to us how God can chisel the best out of each one of us if we allow ourselves as Jesus did.

Holy Week invites us to be like Jesus. We too can become God's wonderful act of victory even over death. As St. Paul says, 'if we die with Jesus we will rise with Jesus'.

I extend a personal welcome to each of you to celebrate the mysteries of Holy Week. Let us journey with Jesus. We have something going on in our Church every day of Holy Week. Please go through the Holy Week Schedule and allow yourselves to be chiseled by God in order for the best in you to come out as God's wonderful work of art.

Confessions will be heard from 3:00 pm to 9:00 pm in our Church and in all the Catholic Churches of our Diocese of Rockville Centre. Individual confession cleanses and illumines the hearts to enter into the mystery of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday. All are welcome.

Lenten Cantata, 'Upon this Rock'. Our Choir has put a lot of effort and practiced this Spiritual Musical. I have personally heard and enjoyed it. Please do not fail to come. It is on Wednesday April 16<sup>th</sup> at 7:30 pm. It is a very nice way to start the three days of Holy Week.

Another moving way of entering into the somber mood of Good Friday is the Tenebre, which is an evening prayer with candles in the dark and listening to the scriptures telling us of the redemptive death of Jesus. Please come on Good Friday at 7:30pm.

# PARISH OUTREACH MINISTRY FROM THE COMMUNITY - TO THE COMMUNITY

We are a ministry of volunteers from St Thomas More parish that perform various services for people who need help in our community. First and foremost, we provide food. Generous people within our parish bring food to the church or to the Outreach office across the street. Our "Pantry People" who are also volunteers, then transport the food back to Outreach, where they sort it and pack it in bags to be distributed. We do *not* cook. We are *not* a soup kitchen!

Our second function is transportation. We bring food to the homebound clients, and we transport some clients to doctors' appointments when there is no other transportation available. We have several volunteers who perform these services, but we always need more!

A third function that we perform is to have special food drives several times a year in order to provide our clients with holiday dinners at Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter. We also give added attention to the children, so that they may receive Christmas presents and Easter baskets! The beginning of the school year is also important to our student clientele, so we provide them with basic school supplies and backpacks. We are also more than happy to share our gifts with other needy groups.

Last, but not least, we interface with the St. Vincent DePaul Society, so that we may extend the help we give to our clients to include financial help as well. Other needs are also filled by this organization, including furniture, etc.

We are a very active ministry, also offering emotional support at times when food or material goods are just not enough, and life becomes overwhelming. We enjoy helping people – and thus look forward to the challenges that face us every day. We encourage those of you who enjoy helping others, and can be non-judgmental in your approach, to join our ranks and bring hope and help to others!
