BAPTISM—As soon as your child is born, please call the Parish Office to make Baptism arrangements. Preparation session and welcoming Mass attendance are required.


MARRIAGE—As soon as a couple decides to marry, and BEFORE making any other arrangements, call the Church Office to schedule an appointment with one of the deacons.

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

Now, Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends.

Jesus is Risen! Halleluiah!! Blessed Easter!!! As we read in the Gospel, the women went to the tomb with spices to embalm the body of Jesus. They were surprised to see the tomb empty – the body of Jesus was missing. An angel told them that Jesus is risen – come back to life from death. On the way back they meet the Risen Jesus himself who told them to spread the news about His Resurrection – that he is alive and never to die again.

Like the women and the Apostles, we have journeyed with Jesus through His Passion and Death and have now come to celebrate Easter. We too can meet the Risen Jesus if we have faith. Let us not celebrate Easter with the mindset of the women who expected nothing more than a dead body of Jesus in the tomb. Let us believe, to see the Risen Jesus.

In all the Resurrection narratives of the Gospel we see that those who had faith met the living and Risen Jesus. May this Easter celebration introduce the Risen Jesus! May the Risen Jesus enliven our moment of life!!. Even though we may be going through a tough time now—perhaps a troubled relationship with friends or loved ones or disappointments and despair around us - the message of Easter is that there is hope. Jesus, in whom we believe, has won the invincible death. He will never let us down and our hope will not go in vain. Jesus is Risen!

The Church where I was ordained a Priest and where I worked as an associate from 1982 to 1984 was pulled down; because it was 150 years old. You can view some of the pictures of people presently worshipping in a temporary tent-church and people at work building the new church. The Catholics in India are just 1.5% of the population. The parishioners of this Cathedral church need close to 3 million dollars to build the Cathedral both for their parish and for the bigger congregations during diocesan celebrations. Being few in number and financially not strong enough to meet the cost, they extend their hands to us for help.

I felt that as my home diocese is generous to share me, their priest, with us for our spiritual needs here, we can share with them a little of what we can afford as a sign of our generosity towards them, to build their Church. Please consider helping them.
