
*MARRIAGE*—As soon as a couple decides to marry, and BEFORE making any other arrangements, call the Church Office to schedule an appointment with one of the deacons.

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

That very day, the first day of the week, two of Jesus' disciples were going to a village seven miles from Jerusalem called Emmaus, and they were conversing about all the things that had occurred. And it happened that while they were conversing and debating, Jesus himself drew near and walked with them, but their eyes were prevented from recognizing him. He asked them, "What are you discussing as you walk along?" They stopped, looking downcast. One of them, named Cleopas, said to him in reply, "Are you the only visitor to Jerusalem who does not know of the things that have taken place there in these days?" And he replied to them, "What sort of things?" They said to him, "The things that happened to Jesus the Nazarene, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, how our chief priests and rulers both handed him over to a sentence of death and crucified him. But we were hoping that he would be the one to redeem Israel; and besides all this, it is now the third day since this took place. Some women from our group, however, have astounded us: they were at the tomb early in the morning and did not find his body; they came back and reported that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who announced that he was alive. Then some of those with us went to the tomb and found things just as the women had described, but him they did not see." And he said to them, "Oh, how foolish you are! How slow of heart to believe all that the prophets spoke! Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into his glory?" Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them what referred to him in all the Scriptures. As they approached the village to which they were going, he gave the impression that he was going on farther. But they urged him, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening and the day is almost over." So he went in to stay with them. And it happened that, while he was with them at table, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened and they recognized him, but he vanished from their sight. Then they said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he spoke to us on the way and opened the Scriptures to us?" So they set out at once and returned to Jerusalem where they found gathered together the eleven and those with them who were saying, "The Lord has truly been raised and has appeared to Simon!" Then the two recounted what had taken place on the

way and how he was made known to them in the breaking of bread.

- 1. Describe a time when your eyes were opened so that you recognized Jesus in your life.
- 2. Relate a time when you encountered Jesus in a place you did not expect.
- 3. Name a person who was with you on a difficult road. How did that person help you?

#### FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends.

The city editor had just been informed that a wire had fallen across Main Street in a storm. He assigned

two reporters to the story. "No one knows whether the wire is live or not," he said, "so one of you is to touch it, and the other is to write the story." We know what will happen if one touches the live wire.

**Today's Gospel is the story of doubting Thomas.** The Risen and Living Jesus appeared to the disciples but Thomas was not there. When the disciples told him of this on his return, Thomas was not ready to believe their story; he wanted to touch the Risen Jesus to believe that He is alive.

Later when Jesus actually appeared and invited Thomas to touch Him, Thomas did not attempt to even do so but surrendered to the live presence of Jesus crying 'My Lord and my God'.

What is needed is not proof but faith to experience the **presence of Jesus.** Proofs can establish a fact but only faith will enable one to feel, relate, communicate and love. Jesus appears primarily to relate with us, not merely to prove his presence. Life is more an experience of oneself and the other in faith and love than a bare fact established by proofs and evidence. Touching (physical proofs) cannot make any one believe in the other. But believing can certainly lead us to touch the other in love. This weekend ... children of our parish celebrate their First Holy Communion. They are going to touch Jesus by believing and receiving the Eucharist in the form of Bread and Wine. In our children we are invited to renew our faith – our believing – in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharistic bread and wine. Every time we gather to celebrate Mass we renew our belief in Jesus by remembering the Last Supper when He offered His presence in the Eucharist in the form of Bread and Wine. **Spring Flower sale is on.** The Order form is found in today's bulletin. You can order your flowers until April 28 and pick up on the weekend of May 16-17.

#### BEREAVEMENT MINISTRY

When a loved one dies, we are deeply hurt and wounded. Knowing the stages of grief will not lessen the heartache experienced by this loss, but it may help the healing to begin.

The Bereavement Ministry meets about twice a year to offer the grieving an opportunity to share their feelings in a caring and compassionate group setting. The group is open to all adults who are mourning the loss of a loved one. The group is run by a trained facilitator, offering general information about the bereavement process, validation of the individuality of each person's journey through it, and a safe environment in which to share feelings with others who will understand.
