A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

Jesus said: "Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever does not enter a sheepfold through the gate but climbs over elsewhere is a thief and a robber. But whoever enters through the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens it for him, and the sheep hear his voice, as the shepherd calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has driven out all his own, he walks ahead of them, and the sheep follow him, because they recognize his voice. But they will not follow a stranger; they will run away from him, because they do not recognize the voice of strangers." Although Jesus used this figure of speech, the Pharisees did not realize what he was trying to tell them.

So Jesus said again, "Amen, amen, I say to you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. A thief comes only to steal and slaughter and destroy; I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly."

1. Describe a time when you heard the Lord's voice at a time you weren't expecting to.
2. How do you use your voice to encourage, give insight to those around you?
3. What distracts you from hearing and obeying the voice of Christ?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Parents of two teenagers are worried about their children's failing eyesight. Their daughter cannot find anything to wear in a closet full of clothes, and their son cannot find anything good to eat in a refrigerator full of food.

Today's Gospel is about seeing and recognizing Jesus. The two disciples see the Risen Jesus walking with them on the way to Emmaus "but their eyes were prevented from recognizing Him." Seeing doesn't guarantee recognizing. When Jesus explained about himself in the scriptures and when they broke bread with Him, "their eyes were opened" and they recognized Him but He vanished from their sight. Then they said to each other, "were not our heart burning within us..." Eyes may see but unless the heart recognizes, nothing is really seen. Eye is only the organ of seeing for the heart. It is the heart that makes the seeing meaningful. When the heart begins to recognize, the person begins to see and perceive even what the eye does not see. Heart sees beyond the physical seeing.

The season of Easter opens our hearts to recognize what our eyes see. It invites us to see beyond physical seeing. The seeing is in the eye but the meaning is in the heart.

Five-year-old, Gabriella Perez, a Seminole County, FL student, was told it was "wrong" to bow her head in prayer before she ate lunch. School officials initially denied the incident took place but now acknowledge it and are conducting a thorough investigation. "My goal throughout this process has been to defend my daughter's religious liberty," said Marcos Perez.

Liberty Institute reports that incidents like this are happening all too frequently. Aggressive anti-faith groups like Freedom-From-Religion and the ACLU have created a culture of fear inside our schools. (libertyinstitute.org, 4/11/14)

BAPTISM PREP MINISTRY

BAPTISM – the first sacrament of our Catholic faith. Baptism sets the state for a sacramental life in our Catholic church.

We were skeptical at first when asked to coordinate the Baptism Preparation Program here at St Thomas More. Having four children ourselves, we were certainly familiar with the sacrament of Baptism.

Once we started our new ministry we realized how blessed we were. We previously were a hosting married couple sharing our married life with Pre-Cana couples in the parish. In doing the Baptism Preparation sessions, we have again met some of the same couples preparing to baptize their children.

Our function is to contact the families by phone, make sure the information we have is correct, and confirm that they will attend the preparation meeting at the church. At the meeting we set up the seating, prepare the video, and greet the families as they arrive. We again make sure the information needed is correct and have the couples introduce themselves to each other. At this point one of the Deacons will share the importance of the sacrament of Baptism. The families then go into the church and are shown what will happen at the actual Baptism.

Meeting these young families of the parish at this very special time in their family life is very rewarding for us, and makes us feel very blessed to share their joy.
