
MARRIAGE—As soon as a couple decides to marry, and BEFORE making any other arrangements, call the Church Office to schedule an appointment with one of the deacons.

Dear Friends,

A man's car stalled in heavy traffic as the light turned green. All his efforts to start the engine failed, and a chorus of honking behind him made matters worse. He finally got out of his car, walked to the driver of the first car behind him and said, "I'm sorry, but I can't seem to get my car started. Catholics for Freedom of Religion:

In this season of graduations, the following are two Freedom of Religion and Freedom of Speech challenges and victories:

wicked regulation," said Dr. James Dobson, founder of Focus on the Family and Family Talk Radio, at a National Day of Prayer event on May 1, as he brought attention to the ACA Mandate requiring employers to provide abortion inducing drugs in their insurance coverage. (WND.com; 5/2/14)

A temporary victory was achieved on April 18 when a U.S. District Judge issued an injunction preventing the federal government from imposing this mandate on Family Talk which was among more than 100 lawsuits brought by religious ministries. "The government has put religious employers to a cruel choice: 'Abandon your religious beliefs or be fined out of existence'", said lead counsel for Alliance Defending Freedom.(WND.com; 4/18/14)

In contrast to his ACA Mandate, the Presidential Proclamation - National Day of Prayer, May 1, 2014 states:

One of our Nations great strengths is the freedom we hold dear, including the freedom to exercise our faiths freely... As we give thanks for our liberties, we must never forget those around the world, including Americans, who are being held or persecuted because of their convictions... And let us carry forward our Nation's tradition of religious liberty which protects

Americans rights to pray and to practice our faiths as we see fit."

Thomas Renker, General Counsel for the Diocese of Rockville Centre, will speak about the ongoing religious discrimination and censorship in our schools, churches, workplace, military and public square.

YOUTH MINISTRY

The St. Thomas More Youth Ministry has been in existence for more than two decades, and our goal continues to provide faith-based support to our high school students after Confirmation as they travel on their journey to becoming young adults. We strive to bring fun and religion together as we tend to the social and spiritual needs of those who will be the future of our parish and of our church. We encourage participation at all levels and as we say in our mission statement, we are "A home that welcomes". Check out our website at:

Through our youth minister, our Core Team of adult volunteers, and former youth group members now in college or in careers of their own, we guide our youth through the faith-based principles they'll need to stay in a close relationship with God. We encourage regular prayer, reverence, and worship and create many opportunities for the kids to learn more about their faith. In addition, the Youth Ministry provides leadership opportunities for our students to become peer leaders, helping to minister to others, or simply to develop and participate in many of the activities we sponsor and support.

We conduct social events and fundraisers like BBOs, pancake breakfasts, Pumpkin Patch, and our semi-annual Acoustic Café. We help out with the Confirmation retreats and support Outreach with a major food drive every Thanksgiving. The students participate in Box City every year to bring awareness to homelessness and join in a weeklong Gospel Roads service retreat, the first one on Long Island being scheduled out of St. Thomas More this July. We also host an annual weekend retreat for all the students who want to participate with a key theme designed specifically for the faith needs of the students. As the parent of two former Youth Ministry members, who have moved on to college and beyond, I have stayed on as a volunteer because of the visible and measureable results that I have seen in my kids. It has been so very rewarding to see all of these young people come to us after Confirmation, perhaps uncertain about their direction or role in the church, and grow during their high school years. Their relationship with God strengthens and one can truly recognize the children of our future and the future of our children.
