



In this season of graduations, the CATHOLICS FOREBOOM OF RELIGION RELIGION RELIGION RELIGION And Freedom of Speech challenges and victories:

1. A Texas HS valedictorian had his microphone cut off after mentioning "God" in his graduation speech. The HS claimed he hadn't stuck to his pre -approved speech in spite of Texas law prohibiting schools from editing valedictorian

addresses. School officials apologized following a demand letter from Liberty Institute (NY Daily

News, 6/11/13; liberty <u>institute.org</u>, 6/13) 2. In protest of his S.C. school district's new policy banning religious prayer at school events, the valedictorian ripped up his pre-approved speech and instead chose to recite the Lord's Prayer. Commenting on this valedictorian's speech, a YouTube viewer wrote: "And that, my fellow Americans, is called courage, integrity, and commitment".

The school board had made the decision to ban prayer after pressure from the ACLU and Freedom From Religion Foundation. This was in spite of the U.S. Dept. of Education's document specifically acknowledging a student's civil liberty to express faith at a school event and graduation ceremony.(The Christian Post, 6/6/13; ADF.org, 6/13)

<u>MINISTRY MATTERS AT</u> <u>ST THOMAS MORE</u>

This is the last of our series featuring the different Ministries that are active at STM. Fittingly, Stewardship encompasses all the other Ministries -

STEWARDSHIP MINISTRY SHARING OUR TIME, TALENT AND TREASURE

Stewards are caretakers of the resources we have been given. When we talk about Stewardship in our parish life, we are referring to sharing the God given gifts we have been given at our Baptism. Just as with any gift, it is usually more precious and meaningful when we use it and share it with others. At STM, we have many people sharing their time, talent and treasure in many ways whether it be formally in a ministry or in some other way in our everyday lives.

Those of us who share our time and talent in the stewardship ministry are working towards helping others recognize the gifts they have been given and encouraging them to share these gifts as best as they can in to support our parish family physically, spiritually and financially. By hosting various events like the Banner procession at Pentecost, or enrichment experiences with speakers, and even this weekly column that has been in the bulletin over the last year, it is hoped that people in the parish will become aware of the various ways they may share their God given gifts. A few weeks ago, we had a weekend dedicated to the Faith Direct program to increase awareness of the benefits of this program and how as good stewards we must be mindful of our responsibility to share our treasure as well as our other gifts.

Sometimes people just need a little "nudge" to help them recognize their gift and then actually share it with others. Those of us in the stewardship ministry actually help people discern or recognize the God given gifts they have. Sometimes we may personally invite a person to a ministry because of the gifts we see in that individual. For example, I may be sitting next to a person who is singing beautifully at mass. Her joyful participation at mass encourages me to sing even though I do not have that gift. By hearing her use the beautiful gift of voice at the liturgy, she enhances my experience of God's presence at mass. I may even say to her, "I really enjoyed your singing; have you ever considered joining the choir?" She might be too humble to approach a person about joining the choir. We can help her make the right connections if she is interested. It has been personally rewarding to help bring the concept of Stewardship to the people of St Thomas More. We are always amazed at the depth of commitment and generosity we see time and again in people who share their gifts in Ministry at STM. We have been co-leaders for many years and have never tired of the challenge to bring people to an awareness of their inherent gifts bestowed by God. Finally, Stewardship is a Way of Life! Here at STM, we are blessed with many generous people who share their time, talent and treasure. The question is "Can I take one step more"?
