SACRAMENT OF THE SICK—Call the Church Office to request visitation of the sick.



**Become a Vincentian.** The only requirement is to have a desire to help. Together, as a conference, we offer the many skills and resources that enable to assist those in our community.



# **Catholics for Freedom of Religion:**

SUPREME COURT UPHOLDS
CATHOLICS PRAYER AT GOVERNMENT
REEDOM MEETINGS:

that Christian prayers said before meetings of an Upstate NY town council did not violate the constitutional prohibition against government establishment of religion. The justices cited history and tradition. (washingtonpost.com, 5/5/14)

"Legislative prayer has become part of our heritage and tradition, part of our expressive idiom, similar to the Pledge of Allegiance, inaugural prayer, or recitation of 'God save the United States and this honorable Court' at the opening of the Court's sessions," wrote Justice Anthony Kennedy (christianpost.com, 5/8/14) "Opening public meetings with prayer is a cherished freedom that the authors of the Constitution themselves practiced. Speech censors should have no power to silence volunteers who pray for their communities just as the Founders did," said senior counsel for Alliance Defending Freedom.

This Supreme Court 5-4 decision involved volunteer, unpaid, rotating chaplains or laity. In 1983 the Supreme Court ruled unanimously in a

9-0 decision to uphold legislative prayers by a state-paid chaplain saying prayer is part of the nation's fabric and not a violation of the First Amendment guarantee of religious freedom.
