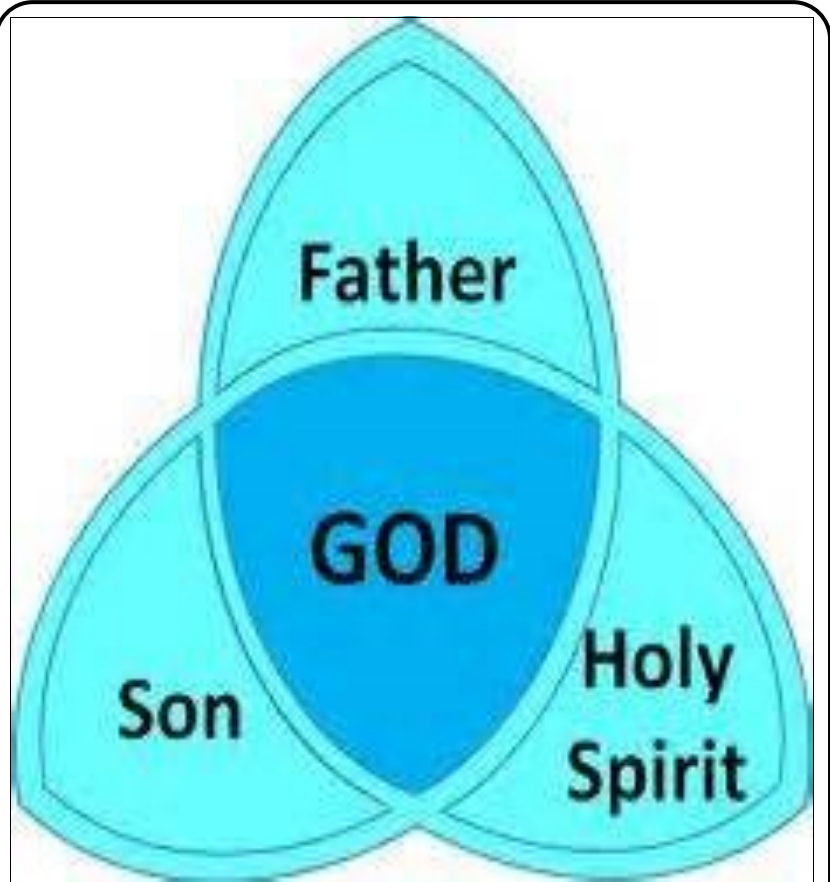

June 22, 2014

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)
Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16a
Psalm 147:12-13, 14-15, 19-20

John 6: 51-58

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

Jesus said to the Jewish crowds:

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

The Jews quarreled among themselves, saying,

"How can this man give us his flesh to eat?"

Jesus said to them,

"Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him. Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven. Unlike your ancestors who ate and still died, whoever eats this bread will live forever."

2. When you say "Amen" at Communion what are you saying yes or so be it to?
3. Relate a time when someone challenged your belief in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. How did you respond?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

The boy and the girl believed that they were in love and wished to grow intimate. One day the boy said to the girl, "Let us live! Let us love! Let us share the deepest secrets of our souls! You go first." True love allows no secret between lover and the beloved. True love blossoms in self-revelation, in giving unconditionally and expecting nothing. **Today is the Feast of the Holy Trinity.** Holy Trinity is not a logical concept or theological explanation of God, but the experiential love that excels all human logic or theological explanation. Love alone can give the taste and glimpse of the truth about God. God the unsurpassable reality can be grasped only by love because God reveals in creation as the Father who provides and as the Mother who cares for creation in sustaining it. When we messed up our life, God so loved us that He sent His only son Jesus to save us to live with God eternally. In order that we share the same life with others in love, Jesus fills our hearts with the fire of love, the Holy Spirit, as a gift from God the Father.

Holy Trinity is one God in the sense there is no

other God but one God. **Holy Trinity is three persons** in the sense that this God reveals to us as God the Creator, as God the Savior in Jesus, and as God the gift of love in the Holy Spirit.

Happy Father's Day –June 15 is Father's Day and we wish all fathers of our parish family a Very Happy Father's Day. All fathers, both living and deceased, are in our special prayers this day. As an unknown author so succinctly put it "Dad, you're someone to look up to no matter how tall I have grown".

Few Facts about our Patron St. Thomas More

- St. Thomas More, our patron saint
- St. Thomas More was a man of prayer, a husband and father, an author, a lawyer and judge, finally a Lord Chancellor of England.
- He was kind to the poor, even inviting them to his home for dinner.
- He sang in his church choir.
- He believed that girls should be educated as well as boys. His daughters were better educated than most men of the time.
- He had a sense of humor, even writing a prayer about it: "Lord, Give me a sense of humor, so that I may take some happiness from this life, and share it with others."
- He was very brave. He stood up for what he believed.
- He was a loyal friend.
- Because he would not give in to the demands of the king to give up his faith in the Church he was wrongly imprisoned. His family and friends could not persuade him to go against what he believed, and just give in to the king. He was condemned to death. He died on July 6, 1535.
- His final words were, "I die the king's good servant, but God's first."
- He was canonized (declared a saint) in 1935.
- We celebrate his feast day on June 22.

Catholics for Freedom of Religion:



On Tuesday, March 25, the Supreme Court heard arguments regarding whether or not for-profit companies Hobby Lobby and Conestoga Woods have the right to run their businesses according to the religious convictions of their owners who object to providing products and services required by the Health and Human Services mandate. This is a critical Religious Freedom issue. The ruling from

the Supreme Court is expected at any time now. Please ask God to move upon the hearts and minds of the justices, in the midst of their decision making, to preserve the First Amendment rights guaranteed to us, including Americans who own a business and run it in keeping with their religious beliefs. Following is a suggested prayer for a decision that preserves religious liberty.

Lord God, Our Father, you are the Righteous Judge over all the earth. We pray that you will have mercy on the United States as the Supreme Court decides a case that will shape the balance between government power and freedom of religion.

Thank you for the powerful words of the attorneys for Hobby Lobby as they argued that our free exercise of religion includes how Christians live and work, not just what we do when we gather for worship, so that whatever we do in word or deed, we may do it in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him.

Enlighten the Justices of the Supreme Court to acknowledge that you alone are Lord of our consciences. Give the Court humility to recognize that you are the King of Kings and Lord of Lords and that you have instituted human government so that your people may serve the Lord without fear, in holiness and righteousness before you, all the days of our life. And Lord, give us grace and boldness to use the religious liberty that we still have to make your truth and mercy known. **Amen.**

During this Fortnight For Freedom look into your heart and decide what you can do to preserve religious freedom. The only mistake you could make is to think you can do nothing. Pray for our country's leaders that they may be moved to protect our first freedom. Pray for our clergy that they may teach and inform us of the attacks on our liberty. Attend Fortnight events and support your fellow Catholics working through Catholics for Freedom of Religion in the cause of religious liberty.

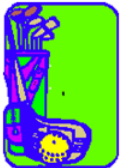
