August 17, 2014
Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Isaiah 56:1, 6-7
Psalm 67:2-3, 5, 6, 8
Romans 11:13-15, 29-32
Matthew 15:21-28

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

At that time, Jesus withdrew to the region of Tyre and Sidon. And behold, a Canaanite woman of that district came and called out,

“Have pity on me, Lord, Son of David! My daughter is tormented by a demon.”

But Jesus did not say a word in answer to her.

Jesus’ disciples came and asked him,

“Send her away, for she keeps calling out after us.”

He said in reply,

“I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel.”

But the woman came and did Jesus homage, saying, “Lord, help me.”

He said in reply,

“It is not right to take the food of the children and throw it to the dogs.”

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Question: How many doctors does it take to screw in a light bulb?

Answer: It depends on whether or not the bulb has health insurance.

Insurance guarantees both the patients and the doctors - patients to receive treatment and doctors to get their fee. But in real life nothing is guaranteed. We live our day-to-day life largely in faith and hope

in people and events. We can only expect, not demand, people to continue in good relationship; we can only look forward, not command, the events of life to be favorable to us. Life is more an act of believing people and hoping to shape events to become better.

Today's Gospel is the story of Peter's walking on the water like Jesus. If we read the passage closely we find that at the command of Jesus, Peter gets the power to walk on water. But as soon as he felt the force of the wind he took fright and began to sink. Jesus saves the sinking Peter saying, "Man of little faith, why did you doubt?" The ability to walk on water is not simply getting the power but believing in the person Jesus who is with you. Jesus is not merely a power giving battery but a believable companion who is always by your side. Life is not merely what you do with the power of Jesus but a faith based relationship with Jesus. Life is not what you can do with your power but what you develop as a relationship with others by believing others.

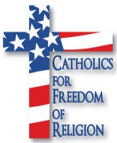

Because of the violent persecution and religious cleansing of Chaldean Catholics in Mosul, Iraq, a Chaldean Catholic bishop in the U.S. has said, "we wish to scream, but there are no ears that wish to hear. ... We want the U.S. to weep with us, but it is not paying attention."

Chaldeans are the indigenous people of Iraq who speak a form of Aramaic, the language spoken by Jesus Christ. Chaldeans are Eastern Rite Catholic, led by the Patriarch of Babylon and affiliated with the Roman Catholic Church. They mainly resided in Northern Iraq in villages dating back to before Christ.

Religious leaders denounce the current violence and forced Christian exodus, with Pope Francis saying the Christians being persecuted in the Middle Eastern country will be the subject of his "constant prayers." 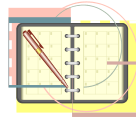


On August 15th we are having our 5th ANNUAL DINNER CRUISE on the Paddleboat Lauren Kristy out of Bayshore.
