# Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

August 31, 2014 Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time Jeremiah 20: 7-9 Psalm 63:2, 3-4, 5-6, 8-9 Romans 12:1-2 Matthew 16:21-27

# A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

Jesus began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer greatly from the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed and on the third day be raised.

Then Peter took Jesus aside and began to rebuke him,

"God forbid, Lord! No such thing shall ever happen to you."

He turned and said to Peter,

"Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle to me. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do."

Then Jesus said to his disciples,

"Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me.

For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. What profit would there be for one to gain the whole world and forfeit his life?

## FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

From a passenger ship a branded man is seen on a small island shouting and desperately waving his hands. "Who is it?" a passenger asks the captain. "I've no idea. Every year when we pass, he goes mad."

In today's Gospel, Jesus appreciates Peter and attributes Peter's acknowledgement of Jesus to be Messiah as coming not from his own effort but from God's revelation in his heart. Peter listened to what

God has revealed in him about Jesus and that is why he could proclaim exactly who Jesus is.

In all of our hearts God always reveals what to believe and how to behave; what to choose and how to decide. Those of us who are of "hearts of flesh" will listen to God's promptings and those who are of "hearts of stone" will be unable to hear God's voice within us

God sends people and situations to reveal what God wants us to decide, declare or do. But we can take God's promptings to be like the meaningless signs of the branded man on the island in the story above. Personal prayers or communal worship are the moments where we tune our hearts to the promptings that come to us in our daily life and which we are not able to decipher in our heart because of our daily cares and stress. May our hearts be as sensitive as that of Peter. Let us pray "Lord take away the heart of stone and give me a heart of flesh".
