RECONCILIATION—Celebrated in Church every Saturday from 4pm to 4:45pm, or by previous appointment with Parish Office.



FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Judge: What crime has this man committed?

Lawyer: He has not done anything wrong. He was merely an innocent bystander when the killer shot a clerk in a hold-up. We are holding him as a witness. Judge: And where is the killer?

Lawyer: He is out on bail.

The law is just a directive force upon an action not on anybody's heart. Law can either allow or forbid an action but cannot decide to act or not. It does not have any effect on our will, or the function of the heart. It can judge our actions as right or wrong but can neither help nor control our heart to decide.

In today's Gospel a Pharisee, a meticulous observer of the Law, asked Jesus, "which commandment in the Law is the greatest?" Jesus mentions that the greatest is the Law of the Love of God and humans, and also explains how that Law of Love is to be observed. The Law of Love is not simply doing something for God or human beings, but engaging the whole person. One should love God engaging the whole self, with whole heart, soul and mind. Likewise one should love the other as totally as one would love oneself. The answer of Jesus invites us to observe the law not for the sake of the law, but to engage and involve the whole person in the act of loving. The greatest law is that which engages our whole self in whatever we do, as an act of love of God and the other.

What a wonderful surprise Birthday party! You, my dear family of St. Thomas More surprised me after the 12:15 pm Mass by gathering in a big number to celebrate God's gift of life to me for 60 years, and with smiles, hugs, kisses, cakes, cards and gifts wishing me many more years. to serve you. Thanks again and I pray for all of you. October 31st Halloween - November 1st, Feast of All Saints. The origin of the word *Halloween* is Christian. Halloween falls on the evening before the Christian holy days of All Hallows' Day (also known as All Saints, Hallowmas or Hallow tide) on November 1 and All Souls Day on November 2nd, thus giving the holiday on October 31st the full name of *All Hallows' Eve* which in popular use became Halloween. God calls us to be saints and has given us the power to become saints. Thus when we celebrate our inner power and identity of being saints on November 1st, we rightfully ridicule and make fun of evil on the eve of the feast of 'All Saints'. The Halloween costumes are geared towards making fun of evil and to highlight the goodness and saintliness with which we are created.

How about an All Saints Mass with Costumes on November 1st? Against the background of what I explained above I invite all children, teens and adults to attend the All Saints Day mass on Saturday, November 1st at 5:00pm in your Halloween costumes, which will be followed by refreshments. Also some of us can come dressed as a Saint (e.g. St. Francis of Assisi, St. Elizabeth Ann Seaton, St. Kateri Tekakwitha- the first Native American Saint- etc.). Thus we can celebrate our power to be saints by ridiculing all that is non-saintly and evil.

This year November 2nd, All Souls Day falls on a Sunday. The memorial mass for all those who passed away during the previous year will be celebrated at 12:15 pm in the church. Letters of invitation have been sent to the families. Please join us to pray for them at this mass.
