SACRAMENT OF THE SICK—Call the Church Office to request visitation of the sick.



FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A father wanted to correct his lazy son, "Son, do you realize when Lincoln was your age he was already studying hard to be a lawyer?" His son retorted, "Right, Pop, and when he was your age, he was already President of the United States!" Using Lincoln as a role model to correct the son ended working against the father.

This Sunday is the Solemn Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Universal King. Today's feast is not our attempt to understand how or what type of King Jesus Christ is. For no king on earth would be a fitting role model to describe or understand the kingship of Christ. Rather today's feast invites us to see how God in Jesus presents Himself to us and rules over us as King. Today's readings portray that God in Jesus is the king who, like a shepherd, is ready to serve his sheep; a king who is not above us but became one of us, even to the point of sharing death with us in order that we may be freed from all that entangles us in our human weakness, as sin and death. Our God -King is so one with us that whatever we do to the least of our human beings we do directly to him. This means to say that in every little thing we do we can see God's Kingship. Our little actions have a God's Kingly stamp--in what we do or say, we become capable of participating in the power of God-King Jesus.

This Thursday is Thanksgiving Day. Giving thanks is quite often not one of the many things we do. In our day- to-day busy life of routines, we can easily be turned into creatures of habit, if we do not consciously live from the heart.

When we live every moment of life in the spirit of thanksgiving or every time we thank someone, we live from our heart. Whom shall we thank and what should we be thankful for? First start with your own individual self.... Be thankful for your body, intellect, feelings, capacity to love and to be loved... etc. Be thankful for your relations and possessions... be thankful for those who provide and for provisions.... etc... Living in the spirit of Thanksgiving will turn you to be a very positive person and spread your positive spirit around you.

A Happy Thanksgiving to each and every one of you.


