RECONCILIATION—Celebrated in Church every Saturday from 4pm to 4:45pm, or by previous appointment with Parish Office.


SACRAMENT OF THE SICK—Call the Church Office to request visitation of the sick.

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

John was standing with two of his disciples, and he watched Jesus walk by, he said, "Behold, the Lamb of God."

The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, "What are you looking for?"

They said to him, "Rabbi" — which translated means Teacher —, "where are you staying?"

He said to them, "Come, and you will see."

So they went and saw where Jesus was staying, and they stayed with him that day.

It was about four in the afternoon.

Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus.

He first found his own brother Simon, and told him, "We have found the Messiah" —which is translated Christ —. Then he brought him to Jesus.

Jesus looked at him and said, "You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas" —which is translated Peter.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A pastor received a letter with one word written on it. It said "Fool."

The next Sunday he read the letter from the pulpit and said, "I have received many letters from people who have forgotten to sign their names but this is the first time I've received a letter from someone who signed his name but forgot to write the letter." Has any of us ever received a letter just with a signature? Yes. We are the letters with God's signature. Our life is the message God allows to

write in the letter.

This Sunday is the Solemn Feast of Baptism of the **Lord.** During the baptism a voice from Heaven (God) reveals Jesus as God's beloved son and God's favor is on Him. The voice from Heaven is the signature of God on Jesus. Jesus comes out of the water as a blank letter. What follows Baptism is His public life. His life reveals the message of God's letter which is God's love for us. The same truth happens to us in our Baptism. Baptism is like the signature of God signed in the unwritten letter of the baptized person. The letter is blank and its message is to be written by our way of living with God's guidance and strength. 

NEW WEBSITE—ST. THOMAS MORE



Almost 20 years ago, the U.S. Department of Education directed the public schools to tell students what their religious freedoms are. Gateways to Better Education published the pamphlet, "Free to Speak", to help students and teachers know their civil liberties. Director Eric Buehrer said, "We want our young people to be bold in their faith. We have let them know they can be. That it's perfectly legal for them to be bold."

"Free to Speak" guidelines from U.S. Dept. of Education:

- 1. You can pray, read your Bible or other religious material, and talk about your faith at school.
- 2. You can organize prayer groups and religious clubs, and announce your meetings.
- 3. You can express your faith in your classwork and homework.
- 4. Your teachers can organize prayer groups with other teachers.
