February 1, 2015 Fourth Sunday In Ordinary Time Deuteronomy 18:15-20 Psalm 95:1-2, 6-7, 7-9 1 Corinthians 7:32-35 Mark 1:21-28

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark:

Then they came to Capernaum, and on the sabbath Jesus entered the synagogue and taught. The people were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes. In their synagogue was a man with an unclean spirit; he cried out, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are—the Holy One of God!"

Jesus rebuked him and said, "Quiet! Come out of him!" The unclean spirit convulsed him and with a loud cry came out of him. All were amazed and asked one another, "What is this? FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

"Early to bed and early to rise makes a man healthy, wealthy, and wise." This is the well-known saying of Benjamin Franklin. Recently I read today's version of this saying in a cartoon. "Early to bed and early to rise means that there is nothing good to watch in TV." This adage "Early to bed and early to rise "is interpreted in two different ways. It is we who give meaning to the act.

In today's Gospel, Jesus begins his ministry saying, "The

kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the gospel." Jesus invites his hearers to change their way of seeing and to see and believe a new reality in the events and people of their time. The Ministry of Jesus for three years did not much change anything socially, economically or politically. Yet Jesus calls us to see God's kingdom to be already at hand. If one can repent and believe in the Good News that the Kingdom is here, one will never fail to see and realize the reality of God's kingdom.

What follows in today's Gospel explains this truth clearly. Peter and Andrew took themselves to be just fisherman. But Jesus invites them to see and believe in themselves to be fishers of men. They had the potential to be fishers of men, but they needed to be reminded of that by Jesus and believe it for themselves. The potential is there, but we need to repent; we need to see it ourselves and believe in the new possibility in each of us.

The social or personal situations may be changed only when we are ready to repent; when we are ready to see and believe the new potential— the God-given potential in us. Jesus invites us today to turn away from our usual way of judging people and social situations and to look for the new potential which is present in the same people and social situations. The kingdom of God is not in what we see plainly but what we believe to see in every people and situation.

Last week we signed a contract with D&S Mechanical Services, Inc. to replace the two HVAC units which supply cool air and heat to the portable class room area adjunct to Walden Hall. It is expected to be fully ready to use in the beginning of May. I request the cooperation of the groups who use the facility to put up with the inconvenience during this time.



We contact the client and arrange to meet with them in their home. We help by paying bills, networking, finding jobs & temporary housing, providing clothes and necessary furniture.

What we have been doing: In the last few weeks, our conference has approved three more clothing vouchers for different families, paid a heating oil bill for a family in need, made a payment for someone's car

insurance and approved furniture for another family. We have also received several calls for help from persons living in their cars as they cannot find a room or apartment to rent in our area.

A Proclamation by the President of the United States - Jan. 16, 2015

"National Freedom of Religion Day"



Excerpts:

"From many faiths and diverse beliefs, Americans are united by the ideals we cherish.

The First Amendment ... protects the right of every person to practice their faith as they choose, ... and to do so free from

persecution and fear. This religious freedom allows faith to flourish, and our Union is stronger because a vast array of religious communities coexist peacefully with mutual respect for one another... As heirs to this proud legacy, we must remain vigilant in our efforts to safeguard these freedoms."

Religious Freedom in the News:

Orange County, FL Public Schools have banned passive Bible distribution (placing Bibles on a common area table for HS students to pick up if the choose) on Jan. 16 - National Freedom of Religion Day - after satanists and atheist groups sued to pass out their own literature containing graphic and obscene pictures. In response, the school board will not allow any materials to be available.

"This is precisely what the Freedom From Religion people want," said FL Family Policy Council. "They want to get rid of religion and that's their strategy... Irrespective of whether someone's a Christian or not, the Bible is one of the key documents that gives us Western civilization and is one of the greatest pieces of literature of all time. So the fact that children are not being exposed to that in public school is an unfortunate thing." (www.cnsnews.com; 1/6/15)
