FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Jim: "You drive the car and I will pray."

Gary "What is the matter? Don't you trust my driving?"

Jim: "Don't you trust my praying?"

Trust is the basis of life. Prayer is born out of trust. Prayer, Trust and Life are interrelated. One cannot exist without the other.

Today's Gospel narrates a story of trust in Jesus by the leper. In Jesus's time the lepers were quarantined in their own colony away from the healthy society. The leper's trust in the merciful healing power of Jesus made him approach Jesus. His request to Jesus, "If you wish, you can make me clean" is an excellent prayer of trust. The response of Jesus, "I do will it. Be made clean." explains how the trust in Jesus becomes a healing power in the leper's cure.

Hope is the essential element in everyone's life. We are not a self-sufficient people. We all need each other and each person has to trust himself/herself. For example every time I wish, plan or try to do something, it is my basic trust in myself that energizes me to act the way I wish. If I doubt myself, I will either abandon the act or become weak to act. Like the leper, let us pray with trust; may God strengthen our trust in ourselves and in each other.

This coming Wednesday, February 18th is ASH

WEDNESDAY. We begin the season of Lent wearing ashes. Ash is the symbol of nothingness. Lent begins with the symbol of nothingness but leads us through a journey of trusting God for forty days, to celebrate the Death and Resurrection of Jesus at the great feast of Easter. Thus Lent says that our trust in God will turn unavoidable death into a glorious Resurrection as happened to Jesus. We will end in ashes if we have no trust. But the ashes of Ash Wednesday invite us to embark on a journey of trust towards Resurrection in the light and grace of Jesus. I wish you all a Holy Lent and encourage you all to participate in various spiritual activities.

- Community Morning Prayer every day at 8:45 am followed by mass at 9:00 am .

- Every Friday evening at 7:00 pm Stations of the Cross for special intentions. This Friday February 20th we will pray for children who live challenging situations.

- March 23rd, 24th and 25th Lenten Mission by Fr. Fred Hill.

Every Lent our parish does a Lenten project of helping the poor by our financial contribution. This year's project is to help the poor of our parish through the ministry of St. Vincent DePaul. Our parish is blessed with member of St. Vincent DePaul who work tirelessly to meet the bare necessities of the suffering people who live in our Parish. What we have been doing: In the last few weeks, our conference has approved three more clothing vouchers for different families, paid a heating oil bill for a

family in need, made a payment for someone's car insurance and approved furniture for another family. We have also received several calls for help from persons living in their cars as they cannot find a room or apartment to rent in our area.

Although we have a close relationship with Outreach and we work hand in hand, our funds are separate from Outreach and require your support.

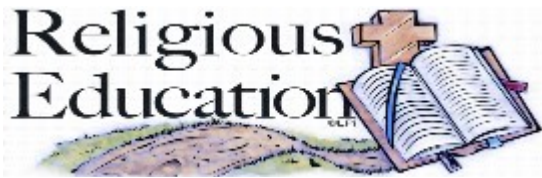

Synod of Bishop Lineamenta document

We have been requested to share the following communication from Mr. Sean Dolan, Director of Communications of the Diocese of Rockville Centre

The Extraordinary Synod of Bishops was held in October 2014 with the theme: “The Pastoral Challenges of the Family in the Context of Evangelization.” This Extraordinary Synod will be followed by the Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, October 4-25, 2015 with the theme: “The Vocation and Mission of the Family in the Church and in the Contemporary World.” The final document of the Extraordinary Synod, the Relatio Synodi, is the preparatory document or “Lineamenta” of the XIV Ordinary General Assembly. As is customary in the synod process, His Eminence, Cardinal Lorenzo Baldisseri, the General Secretary of the Synod of Bishops invites consultation on this topic to help with its preparation.

Contained within this Preparatory Document which was issued by the Holy See to begin this process is a series of questions. This document can be found at http://www.vatican.va/roman_curia/synod/documents/rc_synod_doc_20141209_lineamenta-xiv-assembly_en.html. It is also available by clicking on

the “Synod of Bishops” icon on the index page of our diocesan website – drvc.org. Bishop Murphy is welcoming responses to these questions from the faithful of the Diocese of Rockville Centre, and you are invited to read the entire document before responding. .

If you, our parishioners wish to respond to any or all of the questions, please be mindful of the following guidelines:

1. Only E-mail responses sent to synodofbishops@drvc.org will be accepted.
2. Only E-mail responses that include the respondent’s name and parish will be accepted.
3. Responses will be accepted in the languages the Lineamenta is available in from the Vatican – that is: English, Spanish, French, Italian, German and Portuguese.
4. Thank you in advance for not sending faxes, mailed, printed or handwritten documents. They will not be accepted.
5. The questions to address upon reflection are those found in the Preparatory Document and may be found on the Vatican website: http://www.vatican.va/roman_curia/synod/documents/rc_synod_doc_20141209_lineamenta-xiv-assembly_en.html
6. When responding, specific reference must be given to the question number. So, for instance, if one is responding to question 3 in the Preparatory Document, that fact should be clearly indicated in the response.

7. All responses must be received by **March 13, 2015.**
