Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

April 12, 2015

Second Sunday of Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday)
Acts of the Apostles 4:32-35
Psalm 118: 2-4, 13-15, 22-24
1 John: 5: 1-6
John 20:19-31

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.

Focus Questions:

1. Describe a time you had trouble believing. What helped you to believe?

2. When have you experienced peace?

3. Today's Gospel ends with an explanation for the written Gospel "that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God and that through this belief you may have life in his name." How do those words speak to your heart?

Family and children's question:

Talk about a time when you were afraid. Who helped you overcome your fear?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Jesus is Risen! Halleluiah! Blessed Easter!

Employee: "Sir, I've been with you for 27 years, and I've never before asked for a raise."

Boss: "That's why you've been with me for 27 years."

The fact of life is that nothing stays the same; everything in and around us grows old. Only one thing in the whole universe can really be raised to NEW every day and remain ever young and alive. That is our SPIRIT, our inner reality. The Resurrection of Jesus is the feast and the promise that God wants us to raise us NEW, YOUNG and ALIVE.

As we read in the Gospel the women went to the tomb with spices to embalm the dead body of Jesus. They were surprised to see the empty tomb – the body of Jesus was missing. An angel told them that Jesus is raised – has come back to life from death.

Like the women and the Apostles, we have journeyed with Jesus through His passion and death and now have come to celebrate Easter. We too can meet the Risen Jesus if we have faith.
