# Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

May 3 2015 Fifth Sunday of Easter Acts of the Apostles 9:26-31 Psalm 22:26-27, 28, 30, 31-32 1 John: 3:18-24 John 15:1-8

#### A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

Jesus said to his disciples:

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower. He takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and every one that does he prunes so that it bears more fruit. You are already pruned because of the word that I spoke to you. Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing. Anyone who does not remain in me will be thrown out like a branch and wither; people will gather them and throw them into a fire and they will be burned. If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask for whatever you want and it will be done for you. By this is my Father glorified, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples."

1. "I am the vine, you are the branches". Is your reaction to Jesus' words a consolation because of Jesus' closeness or a challenge to act more like him?

2. What need to be pruned in your life to be a more faithful follower of Jesus?

3. How much time and care do you put into nurturing your relationship with God? Where do you see this bearing fruit?

# FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A fourth-grade Sunday school boy was experiencing his first summer at a church camp. Soon he sent his mother a brief but pointed letter: "Dear Mom, Please send me lots of food. All we get here is breakfast, lunch and dinner."

A hundred second graders will receive Jesus in the form of food--the Eucharistic presence of Jesus in the form of Bread and Wine. Yes, it is the celebration of these children's First Communion both this and next weekend. The First Communicants invite us to cherish the moments of not only our first communion memories but also to revive and relive the Spiritual Reality of Jesus's presence in the Eucharist.

**Every time we gather for the celebration of the Holy Mass**, we gather in Jesus's name and He is present among us. In the first part of the Mass we hear the Word of God from the Bible and Jesus is the revelation and God's message in the Word of God. Then the second part of the Mass is the celebration of the Eucharist, in which Jesus shares with us His Resurrected presence by giving his flesh in the form of Bread, and offering his Blood in the form of wine.

**Every time we come to communion to receive the Eucharistic Bread and Wine** we share Jesus and we all become one with Him. In Jesus we become related to each other. We became God's children in Baptism and become his extended body in partaking of the Eucharistic Bread and the Eucharistic Wine. The Eucharist not only maintains a new relation in our lives with God but maintains life in all our relations with everyone around us. As we congratulate our First communicants let us renew our relation with God and each other.



"First Genocide of the 20th Century" -Pope Francis, 4/12/15

Marking the 100th anniversary of the Armenian genocide of 1915-1922 at a mass in St. Peter's Basilica, Pope Francis RELIGION addressed the massacres in the context of the

contemporary persecution of Christians in the Muslim world.

On April 24, 1915, the Armenian Christian genocide began with the Turkish Ottoman (Muslim) empire executing hundreds of Armenian intellectuals. Then, ordinary Armenians were sent on death marches through the desert, without food or water, many stripped naked. As many as 1.5 million Armenians, mostly Christian, were systematically killed during WW I in today's eastern Turkey.

"Bishops, priests, religious women and men, the elderly and even defenseless children and the infirm were murdered," said Pope Francis.

Russia, France and 20 other countries recognize this massacre as genocide. The United States and Britain do not, however, most likely to avoid angering present day Turkey, their NATO ally. (www.theguardian.com, 4/12/15; www.wsj.com, 4/12/15)

"The atrocities being inflicted on the population of several countries in the Middle East and North Africa continue to mount ... "I joined the Coptic (means "Egyptian") Bishop David

and the Coptic Church of N.Y. at a Prayer Service. I assured them of our prayers and solidarity with them and with all the victims of what the terrorists call Jihad... "However we need also to let the President and elected officials in Washington to commit ... to bring an end to this violence and hatred...

"God expects us and our nations' leaders ... to be instruments of peace ...
