RECONCILIATION—Celebrated in Church every Saturday from 4pm to 4:45pm, or by previous appointment with Parish Office.



#### A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

Jesus said to his disciples:

"As the Father loves me, so I also love you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love.

"I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy might be complete. This is my commandment: love one another as I love you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I no longer call you slaves, because a slave does not know what his master is doing. I have called you friends, because I have told you everything I have heard from my Father. ## FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Some First graders were discussing a picture of a family. One little boy in the picture had different color hair than the other family members. One child suggested that he was adopted. A little girl said, "I know all about adoptions because I was adopted."

"What does it mean to be adopted?" asked another child. "It means," said the girl, "that you grew in your mommy's heart instead of her tummy." Relationship is more of heart than body. No relationship will be a real one if the heart is not involved.

In today's gospel Jesus explains our relationship with him with a metaphor. Jesus is the vine and we are his branches. We may not be worthy to reach up to God. But God comes to us and attaches all of us as his branches. As branches we will be alive forever like God; without being attached to God we can do nothing and will become dead branches to be thrown into the fire.

Jesus invites us to remain in him as he remains in **us.** Unless we wish to cut ourselves off from God, there is nothing that will severe us from our union with God because Jesus wants to remain with us. Our life is to be aware of this truth. Our life is a simple act of bearing fruit like a branch which receives its strength and life from the vine, Jesus. As branches let us cherish the vine, Jesus, to whom we are attached. Let us bear fruits of God because Jesus. the vine enlivens and strengthens us, the branches. Freedom of Conscience Denied: Oregon Court fines bakers \$135,000 for **not** baking a cake:

An Oregon judge imposed this fine on young parents of five who would not design and bake a wedding cake for a same

-sex couple. Aaron and Melissa Klein were sued, harassed, vandalized, and threatened to the point that they had to close their bake shop.

"To be told they're going to force me to convey a message other than what I want to convey - it flies in the face of the Constitution," Aaron explained. "It's a violation of my conscience. It's a violation of my religious freedom."

"Americans should not have to choose between adhering to their faith or closing their business, but that is what this decision means...The judge wrongly ruled that the Klein's right **not** to design and create a work of art celebrating an event which violates the tenets of their religion is not protected by the Oregon or Federal Constitutions. This is a dangerous result for the religious liberty and rights of conscience in Oregon...," said their attorney. (www.frc.org, 4/24/15)
