RECONCILIATION—Celebrated in Church every Saturday from 4pm to 4:45pm, or by previous appointment with Parish Office.



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

June 14, 2015
Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time
Ezekiel 17:22-24
Psalm 92:2-3. 13-14, 15-16
2 Corinthians 5:6-10
Mark 4:26-34

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark:

Jesus said to the crowds:

"This is how it is with the kingdom of God; it is as if a man were to scatter seed on the land and would sleep and rise night and day and through it all the seed would sprout and grow, he knows not how. Of its own accord the land yields fruit, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the grain is ripe, he wields the sickle at once, for the harvest has come."

"To what shall we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable can we use for it? It is like a mustard seed that, when it is sown in the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on the earth. But once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade." With many such parables he spoke the word to them as they were able to understand it. Without parables he did not speak to them, but to his own disciples he explained everything in private.

Focus Questions:

- 1. Describe how you watched something small and insignificant grow into something wonderful
- 2. How have you grown in your understanding of what God expects of you?
- 3. Talk about a time when you did something with love to help the reign of God.

Family and children's question:

Talk about the message of Jesus spread from a small beginning to embrace millions of people all over the world. How are you helping the seed of faith to grow?

PARISH OUTREACH

Another Discussion of "Contranyms"....

So as we discussed earlier, a contranym is a word that can be its own antonym.

Another example is today's word, "Screen". It can mean "to present", as to screen a movie, or

screen as in to protect someone...as in sunscreen. Yet there is a third definition,, as in screening to examine someone to see if they are "worthy"...you can screen your calls on the telephone, or we at Outreach can screen possible new clients to see if they are qualified. To qualify for help at Outreach, you must reside within the parish boundaries, and you must have a letter from Social Services that you have registered as a client. They must show proof of address, so that we know if they are living within our boundaries, and they must fill out paperwork showing personal information. If potential clients come in from the street because they've "heard" of us, or a friend recommended them, we will give them food, because no one should go hungry, but they cannot come back without "paperwork." We take our responsibility to the parish of St. Thomas More very seriously, just as we do take your kindness and generosity very seriously.


