FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

“Why are you adding up those figures?”

“My wife said she is going to lose four pounds a month. I figure that in thirty two months I will be rid of her.”

Life is neither a mathematical calculation, nor a logical solution, nor a systematic reduction or addition. . . . life is a growing organism. Our life will be just a walk from birth to death if we measure it in terms of body. But life is not just a bodily growth and death. If we have the right faith in God, life is an eternal walk with God it grows and grows and has the capacity to live forever with God.

In today's Gospel Jesus explains it with a parable.

Jesus compares the kingdom of God to a seed scattered by the sower. The Kingdom of God is not an ideology, a logical conclusion, a philosophical statement or a moral principle. It is seed of God scattered into human hearts. It grows in us. We are not one of the parts that fit in the ideological or political machinery of society. Rather we are the living cells of the ever growing organism of the Kingdom.

As cells we either grow or die. As growing cells of the Kingdom's living force we sprout, grow and yield fruit. We are not here on earth by accident. God has put us here with his seed within us. We are the living seeds of God, single and small like a mustard seed; We are God's mission; we live by the power and the force of God, to become the largest of the plants, to put forth large branches and bear fruit. Let us be God's seed. Let us spring up and grow. Let us live.

PARISH OUTREACH

Another Discussion of “Contranym”....



So as we discussed earlier, a contranym is a word that can be its own antonym.

Another example is today’s word, “Screen”. It can mean “to present”, as to screen a movie, or

screen as in to protect someone...as in sunscreen. Yet there is a third definition,, as in screening to examine someone to see if they are “worthy”...you can screen your calls on the telephone, or we at Outreach can screen possible new clients to see if they are qualified. To qualify for help at Outreach, you must reside within the parish boundaries, and you must have a letter from Social Services that you have registered as a client. They must show proof of address, so that we know if they are living within our boundaries, and they must fill out paperwork showing personal information. If potential clients come in from the street because they’ve “heard “ of us, or a friend recommended them, we will give them food, because no one should go hungry, but they cannot come back without “paperwork.” We take our responsibility to the parish of St. Thomas More very seriously, just as we take your kindness and generosity very seriously.

Three recent examples of kindness and generosity came from Mr. and Mrs. Tim Fallon, who donated gourmet organic meat , and Mr. and Mrs. Tom Prunty, who donated sausages, hot dogs, chicken cutlets, hamburgers, skirt steaks and pork chops!! Of course, the Rotary Club did their outstanding food collection drive again this year, generating so many canned food and other items, and we are so grateful to them as well.

St Vincent de Paul Conference

The Manhattan Declaration: A Call of Christian Conscience, (Nov., 2009) is a manifesto issued by Orthodox, Catholic, and other Christian leaders to affirm support of "the sanctity of life, traditional marriage, and religious liberty" and signed by 150 American religious leaders including Cardinal Timothy Dolan, New York, Archbishop Salvatore Cordileone, San Francisco, and Cardinal Wuerl, Washington D.C. On the issue of marriage, the Declaration objects not only to same-sex marriage, but also to the general erosion of the "marriage culture."
