SACRAMENT OF THE SICK—Call the Church Office to request visitation of the sick.



A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark:

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Officer: Soldier, do you have a change for a dollar?

Soldier: Sure, buddy.

Officer: That's no way to address an officer. Now, let's try that

again. Soldier, do you have change for a dollar?

Soldier: No, sir.

If everyone begins to show off his authority, then soon life will become a battle of powers. Then power will decide what is right and what is to be eliminated. The majority will choose who must live and who must die. But God does not go by power or majority. God loves us not because we are powerful or strong. God loves us in spite of our weakness.

The first reading says that God sends his prophet with a good message even though the Israelites were rebellious against God. In the second reading Paul shares his personal experience. God's grace is not a reward of our good deeds but a sufficient support in our weakness.

We find in the Gospel that the people are astonished at the wisdom of Jesus. But they could not comprehend how he could get such wisdom while coming from a poor family circle. 'Power generates power' is the worldly calculation. The weak cannot be a power source. What they found in Jesus was just the opposite to the world's expectation. God's grace does not deal with us according to worldly calculation. God turns human weakness to God's strength. Through human nothingness God expresses divine greatness. If we believe God's grace working in us, we will agree with St. Paul that we are strong when we are weak, because it is not we who do but God's grace does everything in us. Let us turn to God and allow God's grace to act in us. Let us surrender to God to transform all our weakness to wonderful manifestation of his Power.

This Weekend we celebrate the Independence Day of our Country often known as "the Fourth of July". It is the anniversary of the publication of the Declaration of Independence from Great Britain in 1776. Let us commend our country to God's care and grace that it may be the land of peace and harmony promising security and safety to all people, especially the poor among us.
