SACRAMENT OF THE SICK—Call the Church Office to request visitation of the sick.


CONFIRMATION—Those who have not been confirmed should call the Parish Office to receive further information.

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

The Jews murmured about Jesus because he said, "I am the bread that came down from heaven," and they said,

"Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph? Do we not know his father and mother? Then how can he say,

'I have come down from heaven'?"

Jesus answered and said to them,

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends.

Son: "Dad, what is ethics?"

Dad: "Well, son, you know that your uncle and I are in business together. Suppose a customer comes in, buys something worth ten dollars but by mistake gives me a twenty dollar bill and leaves without waiting for his change. If I split the extra ten dollars with your uncle, that is ethics."

We live in a culture of 'use and throw'. A person is considered as a person only when he/she is useful one way or the other.. if no use, then no worth. That is the ethics of the 'use and throw' culture. One has to have some use to prove one's own worth.

In today's Gospel people are demanding Jesus to do something useful in order to believe in him. Moses gave food (manna) to their ancestors in the desert, and they are asking Jesus to similarly give them food. It was only on the day before that they were all fed by Jesus, with the multiplication of the five loaves and two fish. They want him to repeat the feeding that happened to their ancestors in the desert at the time of Moses.

Now Jesus takes this occasion to instruct them that it was not Moses but God who fed their ancestors, and the same God feeds them not my material bread but by living bread which is his very self. Whoever has the heart to accept and believe that Jesus is from God, will see in Him the food for their Spiritual Life. Jesus is not material food that will just appease their physical hunger but Spiritual food that will feed the total human self—their body, mind and soul—not only for the life here on the earth but

for everlasting life with God.

Who decides what your religious beliefs are?

In violation of their conscience, the Little Sisters of the Poor must provide abortion inducing drugs and other contraception, according to the 10th circuit court. It said the Little Sisters have to affirmatively give the government permission to use the Sisters' health-care plans to provide this objectionable coverage. If they refuse to authorize that, they will face crippling fines, meaning millions of dollars. (N.Y. Post, 7/16/15)

The nuns may have to appeal to the Supreme Court for their rights of conscience.

"The federal government is determined to keep playing theologian and determine for religious institutions what their beliefs really require of them," said Tom Mead, vice president of The Cardinal Newman Society. (cardinalnewmansociety.org, 7/24/15)

"As Little Sisters of the Poor, we offer the neediest elderly of every race and religion a home where they will be welcomed as Christ, ... We have done this for over 175 years because of our faith in God and our vocation..."

"But now the government demands we choose between our care for the elderly poor and our faith. We cannot do that and we should not have to. It is a choice that violates our nation's historic commitment to ensure that people from diverse faiths can freely follow God's calling in their lives. But the government forces us to either violate our conscience or take millions of dollars we raised by begging for the care of the elderly poor and instead pay fines to the IRS," said Sr. Loraine Mcguire, Mother Provincial of Little Sisters of the Poor (becketfund.org)
