SACRAMENT OF THE SICK—Call the Church Office to request visitation of the sick.



# Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

August 16, 2015 Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time Proverbs 9:1-6 Psalm 34:2-3, 4-5, 6-7 Ephesians 5:15-20 John 6:51-58

#### A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

Jesus said to the crowds:

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

The Jews quarreled among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" Jesus said to them,

"Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him. Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven. Unlike your ancestors who ate and still died, whoever eats this bread will live forever."

### FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

My doctor is a very generous man. He gave me four months to live. When I told him that I did not think I would be able to pay his bill before I died, he gave me another six months. Although we are all destined to die, we have a mission to finish before death happens.

The first reading describes how Elijah wanted to die in the desert but God supplied food and drink through his messenger and asked him to continue his journey towards God's mountain Horeb, where he would receive God's revelation.

In the Gospel reading Jesus invites us to eat his flesh. His flesh is the bread for the life of the world, and whoever eats his flesh will live forever.

We are on earth with God's mission. Our life on earth is not merely a bodily existence to end with death of the human body. It begins here with our human body, journeys towards God while we live, and will live with God forever after our death. Towards this eternal journey Jesus becomes the food that nourishes, strengthens, directs and keeps us alive and brings us to God.

Every time we share the body and blood of Christ in the Eucharist at mass, Jesus offers his flesh in the bread, and blood in the wine to feed us to do the mission of God and to journey to be with God forever. Let us be nourished by Jesus and led by Jesus.

Saturday, August 15<sup>th</sup> is the Solemn Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This feast proclaims our faith that Mary was assumed by God to heaven in her human body. It also in turn proclaims our faith in the resurrection that we too will be with God in heaven. Mary, who bore Jesus, had Jesus as her food for her mission and journey to God. Since the feast of Assumption falls on a Saturday this year, it is not a Holy Day of Obligation.

For those who are interested there will be a vigil mass of this solemn feast on Friday, August 14<sup>th</sup> at 7: 00pm and on Saturday, August 15<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 am. The 5:00 pm mass on Saturday will be the anticipated Mass for Sunday.

St. Anthony's Food Pantry Windows: At the entrance to the church we generously place food for the poor in the movable bin by the windows. On August 7<sup>th,</sup> the six windows on the right wall at the entrance will be removed. They will be replaced by three full stained glass windows. Please see the attached flyer in the bulletin to get an idea of how they will look. This will present the entrance with a spiritual look and motivate our giving with the promises that Jesus has given us in the Gospel of Mathew. St. Anthony, the patron associated with 'bread for the poor' will be at the center window. Please pardon the appearance of the church entrance during construction which may take three to four months.

We will start with Mass at noon followed by a picnic with burgers, hot dogs, chips, and beverages. Please fill the Response Form in the bulletin and be a part of the parish celebration at the beach.



# **Court Rules Government Decides What Nuns Believe:**

The federal appeals court ruled on July 14, 2015, that the Little Sisters of the Poor must obey the federal mandate which requires employers to offer health insurance plans

covering contraception, sterilization and some drugs that cause abortions. (CNA/EWTN News, 7/23/15)

"The government is willing to exempt big companies like Exxon, Chevron, and Pepsi Bottling, but it won't leave the Little Sisters alone," said Mark Rienzi, Becket Fund for Religious Liberty lead attorney for the Little Sisters of the Poor. (becketfund.org, 7/23/15)

"The Sisters consider it immoral to help the government distribute these drugs. But instead of simply exempting them, the government insists that it can take over their ministry's employee healthcare to distribute these drugs to their employees, while dismissing the Sisters' moral objections as irrelevant," said Rienzi. "In America, judges and government bureaucrats have no authority to tell the Little Sisters what is moral or immoral. And the government can distribute its drugs without nuns - it has its own healthcare exchanges that can provide whatever it wants." (becketfund.org, 7/23/15)
